spouts & breaches, steered for them to
be Sulphur Bottom. Light winds
through the night. A.M. calm
all of the land part. Starboard
watch on deck attending at ship
duty.

Remarks on Saturday July 28th
P.M. Calm here we are now with
in 24 hours sail of the Archer Ground
if we could have the wind, but I
suppose we shall be a week or two
yet getting there, seems as if we are
fated to the "clay" with us. Port watch
on deck. Light airs & calms through
the night. A.M. calm. Port watch
on deck attending at ship duty.

Remarks on Sunday July 29th
P.M. Calm. Starboard watch on
deck employed at cleaning ship.
2 hours light air from N.E. Ship
heading N.E. Had a nice gentle
wind from S. steering a course S.
A.M. 5 h. cloudy. 7 h. Port watch on
deck. weather clear and pleasant
at 9 h. check in the yards steering S. by N.
wind 10. Saw Sulphur Bottom.

Remarks on Monday July 30th
P.M. Breeze a gentle wind from
N.W. steering W. course S. by N. Starboard
& I smooth sea. - Starboard watch on
deck. 4 h. clouds rising up from S.
indicates we shall have more wind soon.
Moderate all through the night
with variable wind. A.M. You awake
quite unexpected. We are on the Archer
Ground now is the time look sharp.
Port watch on deck employed at setting
up four topgallant baces.

Lat 18.12 South Long 12.37

Remarks on Tuesday July 31st
P.M. Moderate weather, with a gentle
wind from S. steering N.E. Starboard
watch on deck. - saw 2 h. Sulphur Bottom
we expecting to see Sperm Whales soon.
Breeze beautiful weather cool & drying
and can see a long distance. - took in the light
sail at sun set. A.M. 2 h. hauled aboard the
main topsail. - 2 h. saw a Bark on port tack under
short sail, she wore around & headed the same as
ourselves. - 6 h. the Bark off weather quarter. signal
her showed Richmond & Wood's signal. At 8 h.
saw two more sails off the weather bow. (Lat 18.12)

Remarks on Wednesday Aug 1st
P.M. Breeze light winds & cloudy
weather. Port watch on deck attending
at ship duty. - 1 sail ahead & two off
weather quarter. at 1 h. wore ship heading
N.E. 2 h. Bark off weather bow steered for
us. at 3 h. she had all 4 boats down which
created quite a excitement, but we soon see
they chasing Blackfish. At 5 h. lowered boat
Cape went aboard. - exchange boat crews. A. Houston
of Salt River Capt. Robinson, 36 men & out 14000 lbs Sperm wh. oil. Com.
aboard. 5 h. wore ship. A.M. A. Houston & Henry back in sight.
