

Yor. Gallao. 1860

Remarks on Tuesday Sept 12th
P.M. Strong winds & rugg. Ship
by the wind heading S.E. Hoveled in
shore for Gallao for repairs. Starboard
watch on deck broke out for Ablow.

Buzzed through the night, and heavy
squalls. A.M. 6h took in jib, 7h Starboard
watch on deck took in the Spanish & mainsail
closed reef fore & main topsail at 11h were
around headed S.E. wind blowing a
moderate gale.

Lat 17.24 South Long 91.13

Remarks on Wednesday Sept 13th
P.M. Commenced with a moderate
gale, ship under closed reef topsails &
mainsail on the southern tack heading S.E.
at 1h tied S. Bradford up and punished him
gently for stealing numerous things from
the crew. At 3h, reefed the mainsail.

Sidnight moderated made some sail.
A.M. turned out the reef and were ship
headed S.E. 7h Port watch on deck attending
to ship's duty.

Lat 16.12 South Long 91.03

Remarks on Thursday Sept 14th
P.M. Strong winds. Ship heading S.E.
by the wind. Starboard watch on deck
breaking out for sugar and cotton cloth
having a strong whole sail breeze and rugg.
Midnight strong winds and rugg.
A.M. 6h took in M. topsail & flying jib
7h put on reef in the main & M. topsail.
Starboard watch on deck employed at
breaking out for water & meat filling the
empty cask with salt water.

Lat 16.5 South Long 89.51

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Remarks on Friday Sept 15th
P.M. Moderated. But rugg. Ship
heading S.E. by the wind. Port watch
on deck stowing for hold. At 2h, turned
the reef out of the M. topsail and set
M. topsail & flying jib. Boreading
through the night S.E. with a strong
wind and a rough sea. A.M. Ship
under all sail, weather quite moderate.
Port watch on deck attending to ship
duty. Bunk off duty.

Lat 16.08 South Long 89.33

Remarks on Saturday Sept 16th
P.M. Starboard watch on deck attend
to duty. Boreading moderate tracks
ship heading N.E. all sail out, and
a smooth sea. Boreading through the
night heading S.E. A.M. at
6h took in M. topsail & flying jib, set it
again. 7h Starboard watch on deck
attending to duty. At 8h, lashed and
headed S.E. A.M. Bunk off weather beam
whaler on starboard tack. Boreading.

Lat 15.13 South Long 87.9 West

Remarks on Sunday Sept 16th
P.M. Boreading thick clouds, weather
with moderate and gusty tracks.
Ship heading S.E. by the wind. Port watch
on deck employed at cleaning paint work
&c. At 5h, lashed headed S.E. Pump ship
and lashed off. Boreading the squally took
in the light sail. At 10h, hoveled on the M. topsail
sheets. A.M. 6h were around headed S.E.
at 8h were again headed S.E. Port watch on deck
at 8h, lashed headed S.E. by the wind.

Lat 15.11 South Long 86.59 West
