

Yor Callao 1860

Remarks on Monday Sept 17th
P.M. Commenced with moderate weather and clear. Ship heading S.E. - at 3h. tacked headed S.E. by N. Starboard watch on deck. Through the night squally with some rain. A.M. 7h. Starboard watch on deck. - the weather thick and squally most of the time. At 9h. tacked and headed S.E. by the wind. H. Bush is able to be on duty again.

Lat 17° 36' South Long 86° 06' West

Remarks on Tuesday Sept 18th
P.M. Begins with clear weather but it soon thick and cloudy. Ship heading S.E. Port watch on deck. At 4h. were alone headed S.E. by E. by the wind. Squally and baffling through the night heading from S.E. to N.E. by N. A.M. Port watch on deck attending to ship's duty. - wind & weather continues about the same. Saw a Pinback from aloft about all we can see since we left the Archipelago.

Lat 13° 36' South Long 87° 07' West

Remarks on Wednesday Sept 19th
P.M. Having dark and disagreeable weather. squalls, rain &c. Ship heading S.E. by the wind. Starboard watch on deck. At 4h. washed the deck. Refreshing through the night N.E. by E. with a gentle wind and a smooth sea. A.M. 7h. Starboard watch on deck employed at breaking out the fore hold for the fresh water filling the cask up with salt water. I sent off weather beam "Merchantman".

Lat 12° 36' South Long 88° 53'

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Remarks on Thursday Sept 20th
P.M. Having a gentle wind and a smooth sea. Ship heading S.E. Port watch on deck employed at filling cask with salt water. - at 4h. cleared up the deck. - A merchant bark off weather beam. Having thick wet weather through the night. At 2h. A.M. some very near getting run down by a merchant bark saw her just in time. Daylight commences breaking and fore hold got fresh water filling the cask with salt. Lat 82° 42' South Long 122° 1' West

Remarks on Friday Sept 21st
P.M. Commenced with thick and damp weather and a strong wind smooth sea. Starboard watch on deck employed at the fore hold. - at 5h. finished stowing down and find we have 60 lbs. of fresh water. I sail to the leeward. 5h. tacked headed S.E. moderate and wet through the night. At 6h. A.M. tacked headed S. by E. 7h. Starboard watch on deck employed, broken out for blow &c.

Lat 12° 18' South Long 81° 42' West

Remarks on Saturday Sept 22nd
P.M. 12h. P. tacked headed S.E. weather thick and cloudy with a moderate wind. Port watch on deck employed, getting heat. beans &c. taking the butter out of the cask put in salt. At 10h. tacked headed S. (baffling wind all night. At 2h. A.M. tacked. - at 3h. again. - at 6h. tacked and headed S.E. by E. At 7h. Port watch on deck. - I saw a school of Humphbacks going to the leeward. Lat 12° 00' South Long 80° 49' West
