Remarks on Sunday Sept 23rd
 P.M. Bled a gently wind and steady
 all the afternoon. Ship heading E. by N.
 by the wind. Starboard watch on deck
 attending to ship duty. At 4h. pumped
 and washed the deck. At 6h. through
 the night E. by N. with a moderate
 wind. A.M. which is misty. 7h.
 Starboard watch on deck. We are now
 closed on the coast prospects and fair
 at getting at Callao soon.
 Lat 11° 34' South Long 77° 00'

Remarks on Monday Sept 24th
 P.M. Bled gentle winds smooth
 sky and thick cloudy weather. Ship
 heading E. by the wind. Port watch
 on deck. Plenty of muckbacks. At 11h. tacks
 headed S. by W. A.M. 6h. tacks headed E.
 with a fresh wind. At 7h. Port watch on deck.
 10h. saw land bearing S. by E 12 miles dist.
 Water attending to ship duty.
 At 12h. plenty of land off the bow. and
 we find the Chron some 10 miles in the
 west.
 Lat 11° 40' South Long 76° 25'

Remarks on Tuesday Sept 25th
 P.M. Bled a fresh wind. Ship headed
 E. by N. Starboard watch on deck. Sent
 from 2 points off weather bow to the lee beam
 the 1st and 2nd 1 point weather bow. At
 1h. saw a small vessel off the bow at 5-6 miles
 headed N. by E. At 12h. tacks headed
 E. by N. A.M. calm and a thick fog at
 6h. lighted, some say Piscoador Island off the bow
 6 miles off. Starboard watch on deck.
 Lat 11° 50' South Long 76° 00' Chron 77° 20'

Remarks on Wednesday Sept 26th
 P.M. Calm. Port watch on deck. At 1h. saw
 a small vessel lower a good anchor struck
 him. had a light breeze headed S. by E.
 St. Lorenzo bearing S. by E 14 miles dist. Piscoador
 astern 1 mile dist. At 4h. were ship headed
 S. by E. had light breeze through the night.
 A.M. Calm. Port watch on deck employed
 at washing ship outside. at 11h. light
 air. land in sight 8 miles off
 sails.
 Lat 11° 40' South Long 76° 32' Wind

Remarks on Thursday Sept 27th
 P.M. Bled light air. Ship heading
 E. by N. Starboard watch on deck employ
 at washing ship. At 4h. hauled up the
 Starboard chain and bent it and got
 the anchor ready for dropping. (hanging by
 the ring ropes & Shank Painter) hauled up
 beating up with a light wind. A.M. St. Lorenzo
 ahead bearing E. Ship heading E. by N. tacks
 on deck employed at breaking out
 main hatching getting ready for water.
 Lat 12° 04' South Long 76° 16'

Remarks on Friday Sept 28th
 Ship beating up Callao Bay with a light
 wind. At 5h. Capt. went ashore and sent
 the boat back. Ship beating off 8 miles. light
 winds all night. A.M. 2h. calm
 6h. Ship off St. Lorenzo beating
 up the Bay. Capt. ashore & c.
