 P.M. Strong winds. Ship heaving
 up the Bay. At 1^h. load box of potatoes
 come off 3^h. bag. At 3 water boat come off
 took 3^h. tons. At 6^h. Capt came aboard
 wore ship and stood off. At 9^h. Mid.
 steering N. At 10^h. steering N.W.
 Starboard watch on deck attending at
 ship's duty. 10^h saw a sail and masts
 of humpback &c.

Lat 11.43 South Long 18.25

Remarks on Sunday Sept 30th
 P.M. Having moderate winds
 steering N.W. by W. Port watch on deck
 employed. Steering along the coast for
 Paita. Had a fresh breeze through
 the night steering N.W. by W.
 At 10^h. cloudy. 11^h. saw Blackfish
 going quick did not lower. Port watch
 on deck attending at ship's duty

Lat 11.13 South Long 18.00

Remarks on Monday Oct 1st
 P.M. Moderate winds and fair weather
 steering N.W. by W. Starboard watch on
 deck. No anything transpired worthy
 of note. Midnight moderate
 wind. At 1^h. which and moist
 at 1^h. Starboard watch on deck
 employed. At 9^h. saw a sail off
 port bow heading N.W. The ship
 soon to go Paita and give the men a
 run ashore. Land in sight this morning
 Lat. 8.15 South Long

Remarks on Tuesday Oct 2nd
 P.M. Moderate winds and a smooth
 sea. steering N.W. by W. Port watch
 on deck employed at stowing the
 Butter in bbls. At 4^h. washed the
 deck. Midnight steady wind.
 At 10^h. steering N. 1^h. Port watch on deck
 employed at washing the painted parts
 at 10^h. saw land off starboard bow
 point of view ahead bearing N. 25 miles dist
 at 12^h. Saw two small vessels.

Lat 6.16 South Long 18.22

Remarks on Wednesday Oct 3rd
 P.M. Having a fresh wind steering
 N. Starboard watch on deck employed
 at washing ship. At 4^h. hauled up the
 port chain and bent it. At sundown
 Point Paita ahead bearing N. 30 miles dist
 at 10^h. At night drop anchor off Paita.
 Thursday Nov. 3rd a.m. 7^h. Starboard
 watch ashore on liberty. Port attending to duty
 painting ship &c. Ship in port Joseph King
 entered Paita. A fruit ship M. Luce.

Remarks on Thursday Oct 4th a.m.
 P.M. Sent the boat in at daylight for
 the liberty men. At noon off to right, except
 John Wheeler & George Coate taken leave. Remain
 of the watch employed at painting. Port watch
 went ashore on liberty.

Remarks on Friday Oct 5th a.m.
 At daylight sent in the boat for the water
 got the men behind the boatmen & officers they
 made a complaint to the Amer Consul of
 usage & of treatment. Went the water aboard to day
