

Remarks on Friday Oct 12th 1860
 This morning calm. At 10. Capt. went ashore
 hands on board employed at getting
 the ship ready for sea. At 11. Several
 American Consul came aboard & Capt. Whitney
 Capt. Gorman of the Belina, Col. J. Whiffen
 Smith of Pacific. Open 2 bbls of meat all found
 it good. Cooks look at the pork and thought
 they had plenty. Called the men up out
 of the blubber room. Counsel talk to them and
 ask them if they were ready to go at work they all
 said no some of them declared they would

stop in 6 months first. At 2 o'clock sailed them on
 to 2 fish chain. They will go to sea in 100

Remarks on Saturday Oct 13th 1860
 A.M. Ship under this morning. Ship
 all ready for sea. At 10. Capt. went ashore
 short mast headed the topsail. 10. Capt.
 came aboard. had shipped Frank Rogers
 Wm. P. Thurwood Boatstaves & George Holm
 Henry Bradburn seaman. Discharged
 Henry A. Bush sick. Luther V. Bradburn
 George Castle & Allen. Robert. Discharged.
 At 10. got underway and stood to
 sea & C.

Remarks on Sunday Oct 14th
 A.M. All hands on deck employed
 at stowing anchors & chains. Mended
 the mast heads &c. At 3. Lashed off.
 took the cross of P. Williams and gave him
 his liberty as long as he attends to his duty at
 the starboard engine at night. Midnight
 begins A.M. 11. Starboard water
 first on deck. A.M. Much sail.
 10. Port water on deck. At 10. took
 the room of J. Smith. J. B. Bird & James
 George Allen left in for through to all the
 ship.

 Remarks on Monday Oct 15th
 P.M. Blowing a fresh wind, steering
 P.M. 10. Starboard water on
 deck. Mended of blumblack &
 Linblack in sight. G. H. Anfin in
 the forecath. off duty sick. Capt. went
 At sunset took in sail & luff to the wind
 with the main topsail aback so lay at
 night. A.M. 6. Made sail & steered
 N.W. by W. 10. took the room of
 J. Allen. Star water on deck. Employ
 at making basket for rows.

Lat 2.24 South Long 84.7

Remarks on Tuesday Oct 16th
 P.M. Commences with moderate weather
 steering N.W. by W. under easy sail
 Port water on deck employed. At
 sunset luffed to the wind on port tack
 with main topsail aback. so lay till morn
 A.M. 6. Brood forward & steered N.W. by W.
 having damp & thick weather. Port water
 on deck attending at ship duty. G. H. Anfin
 & P. King in duty. J. Holm, off duty
 and has been ever since his last aboard.

Lat 1.11 South Long 85

Remarks on Wednesday Oct 17th
 P.M. Having moderate winds &
 thick cloudy weather, steering N.W. by W.
 Star water on deck employed at ship duty.
 10. steering N.W. by W. brood the yards
 at sundown, luffed to the wind headed
 P.M. Midnight raining & squally.
 A.M. 7. Wind & weather the same.
 Starboard water on deck. employed
 at cleaning the pots, & attending to
 their duties. Cooks & Carpenter employed
 Lat 2.01 South Long 85.3
