P.M. Commenced pleasant, - with moderate trade steering full & by heading E. S. E. at sail out. Port Scales on deck employed, - 4 h. coaled off. 3 h. squally took in M. topgal-sail. At sundown double reefed the topsails. Midnight full & by under short sail. squalls and rain most the time. A.M. At daylight turned out the reef, having sensible weather squally & rain. 4 h. Starboard water on deck washed headed & later found much better weather.

Remarks on Wednesday March 13
P.M. Up to 4 p.m. 2. tolerable fair weather ship
heaving S. by the wind. Fore watch on deck.
From 4 p.m. it has been squally and raining, & p.m. raised
the topsails and wore ship heading N.E. to
still raining all the time. 5 p.m. kept off and
steered N.W. "round off the ground" & suppose
lost the islands at 10 A.M. passed several pleasant
islets to the wind heaving S. with the colors up.
At daylight made all sail and steered N.W. by N.
Starboard watch on deck employed.

Lat. 3° 36' South Long 111° 41'

Remarks on Thursday, March 7th.
 P.M. Saw great trails, - and very pleasant weather,
 sleeping 2.45. Port watch on deck, employed,
 took off dirty job. Steering a course through
 the night. S.M. watch employed painting the
 bulwarks. S. 2.30. Duty done 11.3.4.

P.M. Commenced pleasant, stepped a course N.W.
Starboard hatch on deck employed at painting the
buttwarks, - at 4th squally with rain. P.M. 1st Starboard
hatch on deck employed at painting.

 Night not amplifying secured weather & not

 child sick. Lat 43 North. Long 117 503-

P.S. Having good weather, steering S.W.
Stays aboard, busy on deck employed, - saw from
stg Embarks, riding D. Horn & Murchett

N. 14, 1/2 Starboard water on deck, heavy & warm
Burst of dust sick. Did not get into long 110'2'

P.P.V. Commences with light breeze, spring N.W. by N. Weather excessively warm and clear, saw Porpoise. At sundown light breeze with N.W. to fresh aback and courses up making N.E. "Layed through the night N.W. at daylight set in courses and steered N.W. 1/2 N. Port water on deck employed, 10 h. braced around the yards and steered N.W. Saw five squid 82.

the night. A. M. commences rain and light
