

The Line A.D. 1841

Remarks on Saturday July 4th
 P.M. Commenced with fresh trade, and having
 a hazy atmosphere & strong westerly current, starting
 at 4 P.M. Port watch on deck employed at 3 o'clock
 put on the "fat-ban" and cool down at 4 covered
 the oil washed the tubs &c. P.M. turned up on
 deck. Midnight laying with head down, at
 daylight took off fat-ban, at 2 o'clock M. Harkness
 saw sperm whales at 4 o'clock harbor watch & two
 boat full of 2 & 3 whales along side. Wind & bar both
 show slightly.

Lat 00° 30' South Long 118° 11'

Remarks on Sunday July 5th
 Commenced with ruffled weather, at 2 o'clock
 commenced cutting at sundown two in on deck
 one small on aloft. Harbor watch first on shore
 cutting up at 1 A.M. Harbors on deck empty
 at 7 commenced to cut in the small whale at
 9 all in on deck all hands employed clearing away
 heads and getting ready for boiling.

Lat 00° 40' South Long 118° 42'

Remarks on Monday July 6th
 P.M. Having a moderate wind and a heavy cloud
 over around headed N.E. All hands on deck employed
 started the fire commenced boiling. Port watch first on
 deck employed, boiling attending to other duties
 concerning whaling, 12 o'clock at 1 o'clock M. topsail, Harbors
 watch on deck unemployed, A.M. employed the same.

Lat 00° 40' South Long 118° 29'

Remarks on Tuesday July 7th
 P.M. Moderate trade and quite smooth. Steaming N.W.
 Harbors watch on deck employed clearing up, & cool down
 at 4 o'clock put on fat-ban, turned up at 5 o'clock, at sundown cleared
 down M. topsail, Midnight hauls at 1 o'clock M. topsail at daylight
 steamed N.W. took off fat-ban. Harbors watch on deck
 coopers' oil.

Lat 00° 21' South Long 120° 30'

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Remarks on Wednesday July 8th
 P.M. Commenced with moderate trade and smooth
 with a smoky atmosphere, steaming N.W. Port watch on
 deck employed at coopers' oil. Mr. Carson off duty
 sick - had some difficulty with the ship few nights ago
 about being below his watch on deck. He says that he is sick
 of the ship. At 4 o'clock cleared down M. topsail and reefed it
 and left to wind heading N.E. Midnight under short
 sail heading to N.E. & A.M. called all hands at daylight
 commenced stowing down, weather moderate and
 smooth.

Lat 00° 22' South Long 118° 04'

Remarks on Thursday July 9th
 P.M. Commenced with light trade and smooth. Ship
 heading N.E. by the wind. All hands on deck at work
 stowing oil. At 4 o'clock hauled off and were around
 headed N. Port watch heading the watches, ship heading
 by the wind under short sail. At daylight called
 all hands and commenced again stowing oil, having
 pleasant weather for it. Mr. Carson off duty sick
 G. Polge & Fowler off duty on the sick list.

Lat 00° 06' South Long 120° 10'

Remarks on Friday July 10th
 P.M. Having good weather, the sailing N. by the
 wind. All hands on deck employed. Port watch
 oil all below stowed down 157 lbs. 500 lbs on board
 at 3 o'clock off all three tubs and washed off
 Midnight hauling with M. topsail slack.
 A.M. at daylight were around and stowed
 N.W. at 1 o'clock Port watch on deck employed
 on numerous duties. Cooper employed fitting
 oars.
