

Remarks on Board Ship Addison
 Thursday
 Dec 25th First part fresh trades from S. E. by E. to E. S. E. Steering by the wind to the S. under M. Topgallant only above Toppails. At 11 P.M. Tacked to the N. E. At 2 A.M. went to the S. At 7 a.m. passed a big stony to the Nth Latter part stony lumps.

 Long Obs. 36° 20'

Friday
 26th Comes in with fresh lumps from E. S. E. & being gradually to the E. Steering by the wind to the Sth At 4 P.M. the wind increasing stowed the Topgallants & studded up the Toppails. At 5 a.m. saw the land to the westward of Cape St. Roque 4 points on the bow 10 miles dist. At 6 a.m. saw ship to the N. N. E. M. part shot on reef out of the Toppails. At daylight tacked to the S. & set all sail.

 Long Obs. 36° 14'

Saturday
 27th First part strong trades from E. to E. S. E. Steering by the wind to the Sth At 10 P.M. saw a ship ahead 6 miles dist. Tacked to the N. E. At 3 tacked to the S. At 6 a.m. again to the N. E. At 7 a.m. took in the Topgallants. M. & Latter parts a little more moderate & we carrying all sail. One ship in sight beating up for Cape St. Roque also.

December
 Monday
 28th First part fresh trades from E. S. E. carrying all sail & beating to windward - Saw the land & one ship. M. & Latter parts more moderate - tacking occasionally - caught a Porpoise.

Lat Obs. 4° 45'
 Long Obs. 35° 15' W.

Tuesday
 29th All of this day moderate trades from point E. S. E. & pleasant. Beating as above. At 3 P.M. shot the ship "Crown Eagle" of 3200 tons from Philadelphia, bound to Buenos Ayres.

Lat Obs. 5° 05'

Wednesday
 30th First part moderate lumps from S. E. At 5 P.M. saw the land from aloft near Cape St. Roque, tacked to the E. S. E. Midnight tacked to the Sth. M. & Latter parts same - saw the land on the beam 20 miles dist.

Lat Obs. 6° 04' S.

Thursday
 31st All of this day moderate lumps from S. E. Steering by the wind to the S. S. W. At 3 P.M. tacked to the E. S. E. saw a sail to the Nth. Midnight tacked to the Sth - At 11 P.M. passed a 1300 ton Brig bound Nth.
