

Remarks On Board Addison Aug 1857.

Monday

Aug. 31st First part strong winds S. W. & cloudy under short sail - Boiling. M. & L. parts strong gales & thick. Noths.

Tuesday

Sept 1st First part strong gales & thick weather from N. W. M. & L. parts moderate breezes from do. Boiling & stowing down oil. Saw one ship at 10 A.M. boats went off in pursuit of whales - sounds -
Lat 56° 40'

Wednesday

2nd First part light wind from N. W. & overcast at 1st - Chasing whales all of P.M. without success - Saw a good many - Boiling & stowing down. M. & L. parts moderate breezes from E. & S. but rough. Saw several ships & plenty of whales 10 A.M. L. B. fastened - 20 ends boats fast.

Thursday

3rd First part fresh breezes from E. & brought boats fast to a whale which at sunset they cut from & lost. Remainder of the day strong breezes 11 A.M. lowered for a whale going quick without success. Employed in Boiling & stowing down many ships in sight. Noths.

In Bristol Bay Sept 1857.

Friday

Sept 4th All of this day light airs from E. & from 2nd to 3rd M. lowered for a R. whale going quick - without success. Saw several cat-capes & two sails. 10 A.M. finished Boiling employed in stowing down.
Lat 56° 41'
Long. 163° 10'

Saturday

5th All of this day light airs from S. & Calms - cruising in various directions saw 2 whales going too quick to lower. saw also 2 or 3 ships & as many carcasses.

Sunday

6th First part moderate breezes & cloudy from S. E. Latter part do. do. wind E. & raining. 1st P.M. lowered for 2 R. whales L. B. dashed at one did not fasten - stowing down. Clark spoke ship Olympia Ryan & Whit. Noths.

Monday

7th All of this day light winds variable & thick weather. 4th P.M. fog lifted for a little & we saw & lowered for 2 wh. going quick to the N. & did not get near them. Noths.

Tuesday

8th First & M. parts light airs from E. & thick some rain. Saw 3 ships & a carcass. Latter part a gale from S. W. Lat 57° 59'.
