Monday First & M. parts a gale from S. W. - cloudy
Sept 9th Spoke ship Genl G. Hantport of Haver
Latter part sun moderate made
all sail. - saw Fin-backs.

Lat 56° 41'
Long 162° 40'

Tuesday All of this day wind moderate
10th pm 1st - Cruising in various direction
saw Hump- & fin-backs

Lat 56° 47'
Long 163° 45'

Wednesday First part fresh breeze from S. & cloudy
11th Spoke ship Genl G. Hantport 10 wh m
Kodiak nothing here also Olympia
Ryan 2 wh on Kodiak.
Latter part fresh gale.

Lat 57° 19'
Long 165° 00'

Thursday Comes in with fresh gale from S. to
12th S. S. W. cloudy. saw 6 wh ship.
Latter part a little sun moderate 11 am
saw 2 pods of R. whales MR Lounes

Lat 57° 14'
Long 164° 32'

Friday All of this day strong winds from S.
13th & rough - chasing whales most of time
got nothing Latter part too rough for
whaling - saw 2 whales from the top

Sunday All of this day a heavy gale from S. E.
14th with thick rainy weather. 6 Pm. the
M. Spsaic ruffled from the foot rope
furlled it & lay under M. Spencer & Stepi
8 Am moderated sun made a little
sail.

Lat 57° 31'
Long 164° 30'

Monday Comes in with strong winds which
15th increased to a gale from S. to S. S. W.
two to under easy sail. saw 2 ships.
Lat 57° 12'

Tuesday Comes in with strong gale from S.
16th & so continues Latter part the gale from
S. E. & rainy.

Wednesday All of this day fresh gale from
17th S. E. to S. carrying close reefed Spsaic
& heading on both tacks.

Lat 57° 36'
Long 164° 50'

Thursday All of this day fresh gale from S.
18th & cloudy - carrying quite a furl of
sail. & wearing ship quite often - saw
1 ship.
