

Remarks On Board Addison Oct 1854

Wednesday

Oct 28th moderate trades & pleasant. All hands getting water &c.
Disch. 4 on Saman Wm Maxim.
Jas C. Weeks in the Fort.

Thursday All day moderate trades & pleasant.
29th All hands employed watering & other jobs.

Friday moderate trades & pleasant -
30th Got off some fruit potatoes & pumpkins.
I watch ashore on Liberty.

Saturday Fresh trades & pleasant - getting
31st off recruits & getting other men ready
for sea. I watch ashore on Liberty.

Sunday Fresh trades & pleasant all
Nov 1st hands employed but shipkeepers
one seaman "Giles" deserted.

Monday. Strong trades & pleasant - 4 seamen
2^d deserted "Joe" James McElwee Charles
H. Brown & John White (Carpenter)
5 Kanakas joined the ship.
Also Mr Chappell 3^d officer.

Left Honolulu Nov 1854

Tuesday

Nov 3rd All of this day strong trades & pleasant.
5 P.M. Bill came aboard & took
us outside. M. & Lutter parts lying off
& on under double reefed topsails.
Capt Ashue - sent off 3 Kanakas
Jas C. Weeks taken out of the Fort &
brought aboard the ship.
Mr St John promoted to 2^d mate.

Wednesday Strong N.E. trades lying off & on. At
1st dark Capt came aboard in one of ship
Harvest's boats bringing our former Cook
having reshipped him again - It being
dark could not send the boat back &
so kept her all night & lay off & on - sent
them in in the morning & kept off for
St. Zealand - got the anchors on the
bows - sent ashore 2 men we found
secreted in the Fort castle.

Thursday All of this day light winds & variable
5th & calms - employed painting boats
making spun-yarn &c.
Lat 20° 15'

Friday Fair past light airs & calms - M. & Lutter
6th parts moderate breeze from S.E. strong
by the wind to the 1st - employed at
various jobs.
Lat 19° 12'
