

Remarks On Board Addison

Tuesday

July 12th First part fresh breeze from N. N. W. to N. N. E. steering to the N. At 8 P.M. finished stowing down oil. M. & latter parts strong breeze from N. N. & squally steering to the N. E. saw two Sails.

Wednesday

July 13th First part strong breeze from N. N. & pleasant. At 1 P.M. spoke Ship Splendid, Smith, of Edgarton nothing this season. 38 mbs. 1650 - gashed with her.

At sunset shortened sail. Latter part fine breeze from N. & pleasant. At day-light made sail & stood E. saw nothing except the Splendid. Scraped our last head of line.

Thursday

July 14th First part fresh breeze from N. & pleasant. Course S. S. E. At sunset shortened sail & came to the wind to the E. Splendid in sight. Middle part a gale from N. E. with rain. took in Foresail. At 7 A.M. wind suddenly shifted to the N. N. & blew hard. Close reefed the M. Topsail.

Friday

July 15th First part a hard gale from N. N. E. under a close reefed M. Topsail, heading to the N. E. Middle & latter part a very heavy gale from N. heading to the S. E. at 11.30. Ship was a heavy sea which took away both darts of B.B. boat & all.

Saturday

July 16th A very heavy gale from N. E. from ship to the N. N. W. tremendous sea running. Middle the same. Latter part moderate. Set Foresail & stood to the S. E. saw a ship steering E. E.

Sunday

July 17th First part fresh breeze from N. S. W. with overcast weather. steering to the S. E. At 1 P.M. set the Fore Topsail. At 7 do took it in & stood N. E. under a close reefed M. Topsail & Foresail. At daylight made some sail with a strong breeze from N. N. with overcast weather. At 1 P.M. it began to rain with thick rainy weather. Shortened sail again & lay by the wind. Saw 2 Fin-backs.

Monday

July 18th First part strong wind from N. N. W. with thick rainy weather. Fine under short sail heading to the N. E. Middle & latter parts light breeze from N. E. with thick rainy weather - heading to the N. E. At daylight made some sail. in consequence of a squabble put one man, Jim Johnson in irons & put him in the run.

July 19th First part strong & increasing wind from N. W. with thick weather. At 4 P.M. took in sail & came to under close reefed M. & S. Topsails. heading N. E. M. & latter parts a hard gale from N. S. W. with passing clouds. heading as above. sail do.
