

Remarks On Board Ship Addison

Monday April 12th First part a fresh breeze from N. by N. E. under weather - under S. N. by W. with full sail set. M. & latter parts calm & thick till 11 Am. then a large spray up from N. E. Course S. by E. A large swell all in a heap. Packed out water, P. R. & L. P. M. 10.5.

Tuesday April 13th First part strong & increasing wind from N. E. with thick drizzle. Weather came N. with all sail set. At 6 P.M. down in the fore, all sails, mainsail & close reefed the topsails. M. part more moderate & clear, turned the vessel out of the topsails. Latter part pleasant made all sail.

Lat 41° 32' Long 166° 22'

Wednesday April 14th First part fresh breeze from N. E. & clear. Under weather. Steaming to the wind to the N. E. saw Fin-backs. At 7 P.M. shortened sail to double reefed topsails. M. part moderate breeze from N. E. Latter part light air & calm. Set up topmast backstays & fore & aft fore topmast rigging & ran in after small jobs. Notes.

Lat 43° 03' Long 166° 30'

Off Coast of Kamtschatka April 15th

Thursday April 15th First part strong wind & squally from N. E. by E. steering to the wind to the N. W. under double reefed topsails & fore course. M. the same. Latter part more moderate & wind from N. W. with some squalls made all sail.

Notes

Friday April 16th First part of this day fresh breeze from N. W. with frequent snow squalls. At 2 P.M. tacked to the N. by E. - but a sea staysail. At 7 P.M. double reefed the topsails & full jib & mainsail. M. the same. Latter part made all sail & steered by the wind to the N. by E. Saw nothing.

Lat 44° 08' Long 166° 17'

Saturday April 17th First part fresh breeze from N. E. & clear weather. Steaming to the wind to the N. E. saw Fin-backs. At 7 P.M. shortened sail to double reefed topsails. M. part moderate breeze from N. E. Latter part light air & calm. Set up topmast backstays & fore & aft fore topmast rigging & ran in after small jobs. Notes.

Sunday April 18th First part - calm & cloudy. M. & latter parts light air variable & pleasant from N. E. - saw 3 Fin-backs & Grampuses. Course N. W. by W.
