

Remarks On Board Addison June

Monday

June 22nd 1838 All of this day fresh winds from S. E. & rough - saw 3 whales. 60 strokes per hour.

Tuesday Moderate breezes from S. E. & E. & foggy
23rd 6 P.M. spoke ship Comanche of Oregon from Redoubt - nothing this season.
Saw the Ice, to the E. 9 A.M. steamed off S. W. by S. for Cape Shaddock
50 strokes per hour Lat 64 09
Long 178 28 E.

Wednesday Light air from E. & calms - cloudy
24th Saw a fin back & one sail. 20 strokes per hour.

Lat 63 31

Long 177 25

Thursday First part light winds from S. E. & foggy
25th Cloudy - some fog. 6 P.M. spoke ship Bangs Tucker & Bark Baitie - Baitie 1 whale on Redoubt - M. & Lutter pass moderate winds from S. & foggy.
Came S. N. W. 9 A.M. lay black-glamed with the 2 ships above again
20 strokes per hour. Lat 63 38

Friday This day moderate breezes from E. & foggy
26th & foggy. - Lying about in the fog.
20 strokes per hour.

Saturday Moderate breezes from E. & foggy
27th Under easy sail - Lying about in the fog. 20 strokes per hour.
Lat 63 50

North of Snadiv Sea. June 1838

Monday

28th All of this day Easterly winds & cloudy & part of the time foggy. Midnight saw Cooper's Whaling to the N. dist 40 miles. Saw also 5 sails - 20 strokes per hour.

Tuesday All of this day light air & calms -
29th Steaming along shore to the E. 5 sails in sight - Land 25 miles dist.
Lat 64 45

Wednesday All of this day light air from E. & calms
30th working along shore. 3 sails in sight
25 strokes per hour. No Ws.

Thursday All of this day light winds from E. Little
31st in 6 miles to leeward of Plover Bay & steamed off shore - 20 strokes per hour.

Friday Light air & calms 7 A.M. came to anchor 8 miles off Plover Bay. 19 fathoms water - 2 A.M. sent a boat up the bay to explore from a body of Ice coming down upon us got undrifting & stood along the land to the E. in company with Bay & Tucker.

Saturday Fresh breeze from S. W. at 7 P.M. thick fog & we dropped anchor off Marcus Bay. A.M. some pieces of drift ice passing us.
