

Remarks On Board Addison July

Sunday July 1st at anchor - as before 1 P.M. fog
 1st Clear - 2 do ship Evi stood in &
 spoke us, 3 do perceiving a body of
 ice coming down upon us got underway
 & stood off shore - first winds from
 S.W. double reefed the topsails - standing
 on & off the land between St Lawrence
 Island & the main. - 35 strokes per hour
 foggy -

Monday Fresh winds from S & part of the time
 5th thick - saw St Lawrence Island S.E. 25
 miles, also 4 sails 4 P.M. spoke Bep
 Tucker, 7 P.M. with her stand off N.W. 10
 midnight off Indian point & lay off
 8 m. 30 strokes - Lower part foggy -

Tuesday Fresh breeze & foggy from S. 1 P.M. cleared
 up - saw the land near Indian Point &
 also 7 ships to anchor & 3 others under sail
 2 P.M. in company with Capt. Tucker's ship
 & ran down under lee of Island &
 came to anchor to fetch water & began
 heaving out her hold & caulking to get
 our bottom low - The Mary arrived &
 anchored 2 m.

Wednesday All day moderate breeze & fine weather - employed
 7th as above - 3 P.M. a large body of ice
 brought by the current came down upon us
 & forced us to stop & get underway - got
 clear of the ice & at 8 o'clock picked up the
 end of our chain & went to work -

In Anadler Sea. June 1858

Sunday June 28th Comes in with moderate breeze from
 E & thick weather - steering by the
 wind to the N. under easy sail. -
 at 1 P.M. the fog lifted - made out the
 mast heads & made all sail. Saw
 3 sails & at 6 o'clock one Clump back -
 Middle part light winds from do.
 midnight saw Cape Thering 10
 to miles dist. - 7 A.M. saw the coast
 (N.W. E) & tacked to the S.E.
 Latter part light air do, 3 sails in
 sight. No obs.

Monday Calm. - landed French ship
 29th Caulaincourt sitting this season
 Cape Thering bearing N.W. dist 25
 miles. Middle & Latter parts light air
 variable & calm - steering along shore to
 the E. 5 sails in sight & the land
 25 miles dist
 Lat 66. 64. 45

Tuesday 30th First part light air variable & calm.
 Toward dawn a boat went off & shot 7
 ducks. - 5 sails in sight. Middle
 part light winds from S.E. & cloudy
 steering by the wind to the S.W. Latter
 part light winds from do. 6 A.M. tacked
 to the E. - 8 do. tacked to the S.W.
 saw 3 sails to the E. & one to the
 W. ship heaving 25 strokes per hour
 No obs.
