

Remarks on Board Ship Addison

Monday First part light winds from S. E. &
 July 1st At anchor - all sails set - at 6 P.M.
 went Ship to the S. W.

Repairs Ship &c. July 1838

Thursday 8th Pleasant weather. Employed on ship & got
 her tipped out all we could & went to
 putting on sheathing as low down as we
 could get - finishing the bows at 4 P.M.
 & did saw the again coming down &
 got underway with a light air on shore
 found the ice contacting us & would drive
 us upon the point of the Island. Let go
 our anchor & lay going through broken ice
 till 1 P.M. when a large body of solid ice
 coming upon us we slipped our cable &
 warped around it & let go our S^e anchor
 in 5 fathoms water - continued going through
 ice & all hands cutting till 6 A.M. when
 we got clear water again - hoisted up, got
 underway & picked up our other chain
 & hove the anchor up & got off away from
 the place - steering along shore to the S. W.
 All hands filling salt water, stowing hold
 &c.

Friday 9th Fresh & moderate winds from S. E. to S. W.
 & pleasant, steering along the land to the N. W.
 in company with B. Tucker & J. Chauncy.
 Sometimes laying to back. Thus Lieg Laying
 along shore - saw many Muske Aggers
 filling water &c.
