

Remarks on Board Addison 1838

Saturday

Aug 14th 1838 Strong wind from S. & rough-
 12th an 13th Boiling - 3 P.M. lowered 2 boats
 for a whale without success. 10 A.M.
 dropped one boat for another - saw him
 no more - Land 25 miles dist. 500

Sunday First part fresh breeze from S. Boiling
 15th Cruising in various directions but saw
 no whales. Several ships in sight 6 P.M.
 landed with ship Wm Thompson 5th
 M. & Latter part light winds from E.
 4 A.M. lowered for a Bow Head whale
 L. 13. got & took alongside at 7th do.
 began cutting the Cep bearing S. 1/2 E.
 dist 20 miles.

Monday Moderate breeze from N. E. & pleasant
 15th Finished cutting - 2 A.M. lowered 2
 boats N. & S. for whales N. 13 got one
 which we took alongside & began cutting
 at 8 do. - 10. Lowered 10 & 13 boats for
 whales W.R. finished cutting - brass off
 as above. - Several ships in sight & the
 land 20 miles dist.

In Arctic Ocean Aug 1838

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Tuesday

Aug 17th 1838 Light winds & pleasant, 3 P.M.
 H. 13 took a whale alongside & went to
 cutting finishing at 7 do. - Latter part
 some fog, saw a few ships & whales - lowered
 one boat without success. Boiling &
 clearing away heads

Wednesday

18th Moderate winds & some fog & a little
 rain - Boiling & stowing down oil -
 2 P.M. a boat boarded us from St. Mary
 5th do. 8 A.M. lowered 3 boats for
 whales L. 13. started but boatsteward
 sniped him - Land 25 miles dist

Thursday

19th Light winds from S. & steering in various
 directions - saw no whales. Boiling &
 stowing down

Friday

20th Light winds N. N. E. some rain.
 Employed as above - landed with bark
 Ballie 5th do. - 350 strikes.

Saturday

21st First part calm & thick 3 P.M. cleared up
 saw the land to the E. of Cape Lisburne 10
 miles. Light winds from S. M. & Latter part
 fresh gale from S. & clear - Boiling &
 stowing down.
