

Remarks On Board Addison Sept

Wednesday

Sept 1st 1838 Winds from N. N. E. & cloudy
steering in various directions & storm
finished Boiling.

Thursday First part strong wind from N. N. E.
2nd & cloudy - steering to the N. W. 7 P.M.
was spoken by ship Chile 9th M. &
Latter part moderate N. E. winds &
fog. Came S. W. by N. daylight began
blowing down

Friday Moderate winds from N. E. & part
of the time raining - steering by the wind
to the N. W. - 7 A.M. started S. & S. W.
at 11 A.M. then came to the wind with
head-gale aback. - 250 strokes.

Friday Light winds & foggy. 7 P.M. spoke
ship Emerald of Sag Harbor, Collier
2 Wth. 7 A.M. kept off to the S. W.
& made all sail.

Saturday Comes in with light winds from E. &
1st fog. 7 P.M. tacked to the E. with some
breeze from S. W. part moderate breeze
from N. & clear - came S. S. W. 6 A.M.
spoke the Baltic 8 A.M. & Boiling 9 A.M.
Landed for a while - did not see him
again

Lat 68° 45'

In Arctic Ocean Sept 1838

Sunday

Sept 15th 1838 Strong winds from N. E. & part
thick & some rain. 3 P.M. looked
for a Bow & Reed did not see him
again. - double reefed the topsails.
900 strokes.

Monday Moderate breezes from N. N. E. & fog.
6th saw 3 sails. - heading back & forth
waiting to see out.

Tuesday Fresh winds from N. N. E. with fog &
some rain 8 A.M. it cleared up a
little & we spoke bark Black Ramon
2 Wth - 800 strokes.

Wednesday First part strong & latter part moderate
8th breeze from N. E. & some rain. 6 P.M.
spoke bark Pauline 5 Wth. 7 A.M. double
reefed the topsails - saw "Cygnet" 9 A.M.
steamed S. S. E. & made all sail for the S. W.

Thursday First part fresh winds from N. E. with
patches of fog. - came S. E. by S. 11 P.M.
came to the wind & lay till daylight then
kept off S. by E. for the S. W. 8 A.M. saw East
Cape ahead 25 miles off. - stood up
almost it. Saw many "Muske Chigss."
