 Wednes. Oct 6th First part moderate breeze from N.E. & raining. Course E. S. E. M. & Latter parts fresh breeze from N.E. & pleasant - Course S. E. by E. saw the lig. took up both pumps & drew the boxes - Pumped out stores
 Lat 34° 41'
 Long 158° 40'

Thursday First part small fresh breeze from N.E. & pleasant - Course S. E. by E. we sail set. Employed washing down. Spoke & gamia with ship Abraham Barker 3 mi from Ocholek Is.
 M. & Latter parts the same.
 Lat Obs 32° 08'
 Long 157° 16'

Friday First part fine breeze from E. N. E. & pleasant. Steering by the wind to the S. E. M. & Latter parts light air E. & pleasant - Employed washing & drying down & getting on rigging
 Lat 30° 20'

Saturday First part light air E. & pleasant. M. & Latter parts do. from N.E. set stores - Course S. E. by S. with all sail set - Employed in drying & bundling down & got on rigging & setting etc. A. Barker in sight
 Lat Obs. 39° 42'

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 Sunday Oct 10th 1838. First part light winds from N.E. Course S. E. by S. - M. & Latter parts fine breeze from E. & pleasant Course S. E. by E. bundling down & Pumped 1400 strokes
 Lat Obs. 27° 38'

Monday Course in with fine breeze from E. N. E. & pleasant. Course S. by E. A. Barker in sight. M. & Latter parts fine breeze from E. S. E. - bundling down
 Lat 25° 13'

Tuesday First part moderate winds from E. S. E. some squalls. At 3 P.M. a Kanaka "Chief" known died after being sick about 8 days of kidney complaint & distention. At 6 P.M. our ship to the E. & hauled back & hauled out to dead water to the S. M. part very heavy - with much thunder lightning & rain - washing ship
 Lat Obs 23° 31'
 Long 157° 12'

Wednesday First part moderate winds from E. S. E. & pleasant. gamia with Abraham Barker M. the J. Am. saw the E. end of the point on weather bar 35 miles distant & do. together off & so began beating up from the weather end of the island 2 miles in company.
