

Remarks On Board Addison 1858

Thursday
Oct 14th 1858 Comes in with a S. E. breeze
wind beating up for the windward
point 3 ships doing the same.
Mr. part & morning very squally
& variable. 10 AM. got the trades &
run in for Catfish. Run strikes.

Friday Comes in with fine breeze from E.
15th & pleasant - at sunset got down
off Catfish Head & came to the
wind to wait for daylight - several
sails lying off & on.
At 9 AM. the pilot & steamer tug
came off & took us in

Saturday All of this day fresh trades & pleasant
16 Shipped 1131 lbs of rice to clipper
ship "The Lark" of New York -
Mr. Chappell Disch.

Sunday All day fresh trades & pleasant
17th All hands but ship repairs ashore on
Liberty.

Monday
18th

On Board Bark Sarah Sheaf 1858

Thursday
Oct 26th 1858.
Monday night came aboard of
Sarah Sheaf & went on duty in the
morning. Took up our moorings & at
11 AM. the pilot & steamer took us
out to sea. Lay off & on Capt. Loper
& Cooper being ashore.

Wednesday. All day fresh trades & pleasant
Oct 27th Lying off shore.

Thursday All day fresh trades. At 2
Oct 28th PM. the Capt. came aboard &
we made sail stung by the wind
to the S. E. - set up the topmast
backstays & weather topmast shrouds,
fitting boats &c. Lat 19° 38'

Friday Light airs from S. & calms - under
29th the eye of Orpheus.
Mr. Sheaf came. At 8 AM. a
fine breeze from S. E. heading
S. S. W. - setting up fore topmast
backstays topmast rigging &c. & repairing
a span boat. Lat 19° 04'
