& pleasant - 2. P.M. saw Christmas
Island ahead 15 miles dist. kept off
set studdsails & passed the lee end of it
at 5 P.M. & then hauled up by the union
to the 1st - took in studdsails.
M. & latter parts fine breeze from E. to E. S. E.
& pleasant. Comm. S. by E. set up m. studdsails
& topgallant backstays. & repaired a
span Tonsail.

Just up First part fine bugs from E. & E. & E.
 Pleasant, steering to the wind to the
 S^W - saw a Fl. - back.
 M. & latter parts fine bugs from E.
 down S. E. & upwind & sent a span
 for sale. -

McClos. Comes in with five boys from
10th E^a Comm S. L. & at 6 P.M. at a
fore & main topmast studdsail.
M. & Latter parts the same. at a main
topgallant studdsail, - employed repairing
a spare topsail, & a spare boat.

11th / First part moderate breeze from N. E.
& pleasant. Comm. S. S. E. lower strata
& all the others set.
Mr. & Latter parts the same
Pumped 100 strokes. Lat 45° 31'
Long 158° 08'

May 12th All of this day light winds from N. E. — at daylight saw Peurto's island ahead 10 miles dist. Kept off & passed to the N. of it — 3 canoes came off bringing a few Pearl Oyster shells. Watch employed in job on the rigging making spun-yarn &c. pumped for strike.

Sunday First part light air from N^o & S. & S. W.
13th / Comm. S. - all sail set.
M. & Luller parts moderate breezes
from N. E. All studdsails set -
Painted S. boat
350 strokes. Lat. 10° 41'

Sunday All of this day fine heavy rain
14th E. & pleasant - tho a few light squalls
studded in
300 strikes East. 3' 33'
Long 61 158° 38'

Monocotyledonous in with fine rays from
15th E. & E by S. strong by the wind to the
S. W. & later pass the same
pumped 600 strokes. Lat Obs. 16° 11'
