 latter part a light breeze from S. E. & distant

29<sup>th</sup> First part moderate breeze from E. N. E.  
 & pleasant. At 7 P.M. shifted to  
 the 1<sup>st</sup> M. the same - latter part  
 light breeze from W. & of - Course E. by S.  
 1800 strokes. 1800 -

Sunday All of this day fine breeze from W.  
 30<sup>th</sup> with overcast weather part of the time  
 from 7 P.M. distant the L. & sails  
 in the morning made them again  
 & M. Royal also. 1800 strokes.

2<sup>nd</sup> 1859. First part of this day strong wind  
 from W. & distant. Course E. N. E. 1800 strokes.  
 M. & latter part the same. 1800 strokes.

3<sup>rd</sup> All day strong wind from W. & distant  
 Cloudy course E. N. E. 1800 strokes.  
 Lat 57° 52'  
 Long 68° 43'

Friday

4<sup>th</sup> First part strong winds from N. W. Course  
 N. E. by S. 7 P.M. distant the L. & sails  
 & immediately after rose a large sperm  
 whale close to the ship on which beam  
 dropped the L. & but could not get to  
 him before he went down - came aboard  
 & killed the course it blowing by the line  
 - a gale. latter part moderate breeze  
 from N. & saw Cape Horn bearing  
 N. N. W. dist 40 miles. saw five boats  
 & a bark bound W. 1200 strokes.  
 Lat 56° 18'

Saturday

5<sup>th</sup> All of this 24 hours moderate wind  
 & variable - mostly from N. & distant. saw a large  
 ship under sail & steam bound N. E. by E.  
 P.M. shortened sail. U.M. saw a large  
 land to the N. Lat 58° 21'  
 1200 strokes.

Sunday

6<sup>th</sup> First part moderate wind from S. & distant  
 a fair storm - M. & latter part, fresh  
 gales from W. & distant. shortened sail  
 according to order. Lat 54° 23'  
 Long 63° 56'
