

Evening & Tides Nov. 1859

Friday

Nov 18th 1859. First part moderate breeze from S.W. E. & pleasant course N.W. by E. - gunn
 note - 3 P.M. our ship detained by the
 wind to the E. did not take in sail
 at night. - M. & Latta parts do, do
 Saw a "Sulphur Bottom" 1200 strokes
 Lat 38° 55'
 Long 52° 59'

Saturday First part as above - "striking" to the
 19th E. employed on rigging

M. part light air & calms with thick
 fog. Latta part moderate breeze from
 E. steering by the wind to the S.W. E.
 all sail out - thick w.
 1500 strokes. Notes

Sunday First part moderate breeze from E.
 20th & on east weather - steering as above
 sunset shortened sail.

Daylight made sail with moderate
 breeze from S.E. & cloudy - steering by
 the wind to the S. saw a fire-boat
 1400 strokes. Lat 37° 49'
 Long 52° 32'

Monday Comes in with fine breeze from
 21st S.E. & cloudy sunset took in the light
 sails & tacked to the E.S.E.

Midnight tacked to the S. saw a
 sail going S.

1800 strokes

Lat 37° 18'
 Long 52° 12'

On Board Bark Sarah's Nov. 1859

Friday

Nov 22nd 1859. First part light wind from E. & E.
 pleasant M.R. tacked to the S.E. saw
 a Sulphur Bottom. M. & Latta parts
 moderate breeze from E.S.E. & pleasant
 in the night tacked to the S. saw a
 ship bound S. 9 am. saw a line off
 the lee bow 8 miles dist. ran off anchor
 but saw nothing more Lat 37° 15'
 1800 strokes. Long 52° 14'

23rd Comes in with fresh breeze from E.S.E.
 pleasant - 6 P.M. tacked to the S.E.
 saw a fire-boat. Employed on rigging -
 M. & Latta part moderate breeze from
 S.W. E. & pleasant - steering by the wind
 to the E. all sail out - bent & set 1 m.
 Iron Royal, also bent this steel sails.
 800 strokes Lat 37° 55'
 Long 50° 31'

24th Comes in with moderate breeze from
 S.W. E. & pleasant - steering by the wind
 to the E. Employed on the rigging.
 M. & Latta parts light air from S.W.
 course S.E. & E. - Employed on rigging
 & blacksmithing &c. 1200 strokes Lat 37° 26'
