to the N. a true in sight going the
same way. Mr. D. Allen boats from
traps from do. to E. employed in
washing ship & getting ready for
painting. Lat 66. 16' 32'
2200 strokes. Long Am 33. 38'

Wednes. Miss paid light from E. N. 6
13th to E. of pleasant finished washing
ship — sent down Mr. Spencer, J. G. H.
Mr. & latter parts the same —
Employed painting ship. 1800 Stokes
Lat 14° 16'
Long Chs 53° 30'

Thurs. Comes in with light trade from E
14th pleasant course N. N. E. employed
painting ship. M. & Latter part the
same 1600 strokes.

Lats. 15° 18'
Long. Chs. 53° 53 1/2.

Friday Comes in with light trades from E &
15th pleasant— come when she will go it
N. N. E. saw a sail bound N. E.
M. & Lutter parts the same—
18.0 strokes. Lat 18° 41'
Long — 53° 12'

Sales. Commenced by E. & Co. - employed
at various places. Lat 70° 21'
Long Chs 55° 01'

Friday First part of this day light wind from
S. to S. E. & pleasant. Comm. 11^h 30^m E.
S. E. At 5 P.M. rose a sail astern
coming after us. In latter parts the
sailed - 1500 strokes. Lat obs 8° 53'
Long Obs 33° 15'

Sunday First 5 m. parts light wind from
S. E. & pleasant. Course N. N. E. Latter
parts light air from E. & disagree
repaid the job, 1000 strokes.

Lat 33° 37'
Long 33° 32'

Today First part like air variable & calm
19th M. & Latter part much the same with
the air from N. E.
Woods strokes. Last hrs 6⁵⁴

21st Calms. Calms in with light airs from E. N. E.
 E. & pleasant - In part moderate to
 light rain & squalls from E. At 8 A.M.
 a fine breeze sprang up from N. E. &
 pleasant - set all the Hudson's - Com.
 N. & E. At 8 A.M. a clipper ship
 passed us going N.
 1000 ships.
