April 21st 1859 First part fine trades from

Friday All of this day light winds from E.
23rd & S. E. some rain - Comm. N. by N. the
bark in sight also a big bound N.
1800 strokes. Lat Obs. 1° 30'
Long Obs. 35° 39'

Saturday All of this day light wind from E.
23rd & S. E. At 4 P.M. transferred the bark
the former to be the "Kleber" of 1st Division, Comm.
master S. S. day from Singapore for N. York
M.R. bound for Blackfish without
success. 1800 strokes. Lat Obs. 26° 5'
Long Obs. 36° 09'

Sunday First part light air from N. & pleasant
24th M. & latter parts light air variable & calms
making scarce and foggy. the bark in
company. 1800 strokes. Lat Obs.

Monday All of this day light air variable
25th & calms - the bark in sight -
1800 strokes. Lat Obs. 24° 5'
Long Obs. 36° 25'

Friday April 26th 1859 First part light air from S. E. &
squally & calms - M. & latter parts
ditto ditto ditto - the bark in sight;
1800 strokes. Lat Obs. 01° 1'
Long Obs. 36° 52'

Saturday First part a light breeze from E. S. E.
27th S. E. & squally in the N. at 7 P.M.
a squall of rain from N. that quenched
all our wind & left us again sitting
in a calm. M. part not much
wind from anywhere but plenty of rain.
of Am. a fine breeze from N. E. but squally
Comm. N. by N. bark in sight. 1800 strokes
the bark in sight. Lat Obs. 1° 07' N.
Long Obs. 37° 15'

Sunday First part fine breeze from N. E. & E.
28th S. E. with plenty of rain squalls -
Comm. N. by N. at 10 A.M. & started
low & light - M. & latter parts fresh breeze
from N. E. & very squally - took in Royal
& studdsails again the M. Royal & a
few topmast studdsails having parted the
luck rope - abundance of rain.
2000 strokes. Lat Obs. 2° 46'
Long " 39° 05'

Monday First part fresh N. E. wind & very squally
29th some of them quite hard for which we took
topmast halliards & plenty of rain -
Comm. N. by N. - M. & latter parts fine
steady trades from N. E. & pleasant
comm. as above. Lat Obs. 4° 51'
2400 strokes. Long Obs. 41° 13'
