Saturday Dec 27th 1856
Paper with good weather and light
winds from S.E. heading S.S.W. midle
and later part baffled winds so ends
Lat by Ob 32.14 South

Sunday Dec 28th 1856
Comes in with Squally weather and
variable winds midle and later part
good weather and light winds from
N.E. coars S.W. so ends
Lat by Ob 33.27 South Long 49.10 West

Monday Dec 29th 1856
Comes in with good weather and light
winds from N.E. coars S.W. at 5 P.M.
raised 2 pairs of Spearm whales going
quick to the windward board and
chart midle and later part the same
so ends Lat by Ob 34.49 S Long 48.40 West

Tuesday Dec 30th 1856
Comes in with good weather and light
winds from N.E. coars S.W. midle
part strong winds from South heading
N.S.W. one pig in site board N.E.
midle and later part more and rate
so ends Lat by Ob 35.24 S Long 46.20 W

Wednesday Dec 31th 1856
Comes in with good weather and
strong winds from S.E. heading S.S.W.
at 6 P.M. raised Spearm whales board
and chart midle and later part
much the same at 10 A.M. raised
1 Spearm whale and chart so ends
Lat by Stock 37.00 S Long 47.00 W

Comes in with good weather and strong
winds from North heading S.W. midle and
later part the same so ends these 24 hours
Lat by Ob 37.56 South Long 48.20 W

Friday Jan 2nd 1857
Comes in with strong winds and thick
weather heading S.E.W. at 8 P.M.
rany so the reefed the top. Sails midle
and later part good weather so ends
Lat by Ob 40.00 South Long 49.00 West

Saturday Jan 3rd 1857
Paper with good weather and strong
winds from N.S.W. heading South
midle and later part calm so ends
Lat by Ob 40.42 S Long 50.10 West

Sunday Jan 4th 1857
Comes in with good weather and calm
one ship in sight midle and later part
strong winds from N.E. coars S.W. so ends
Lat by Ob 41.57 South Long 51.30 West

Monday Jan 5th 1857
Comes in with good weather and strong
winds from N.W. heading S.W. by S
under so the reefed top. Sails midle and
later part bad squally weather so ends

Tuesday Jan 6th 1857
Commences with strong winds from
West and rany heading S.S.W. one ship
in sight midle and later part strong
winds men employed in baling out water
so ends Lat 44.19 S Long 52.19 West
