

Remarks On Board Ship

Sunday June 7th 1857
Comes in with strong winds from East and ruggie heading E. S. E. & ship in sight saw whales and chert later part strong winds and rany so ends No 66

Monday June 8th
comes in with strong winds from N. E. and rany heading E. S. E. Saw a ship heading of S. S. W. making all sail made and later part good weather so ends
Lat by 66 55.57 North

Tuesday June 9th
Comes in with good weather and strong winds from E. S. E. heading S. E. made and later part the same so ends No 66

Wednesday June 10th
Comes in with good weather and strong winds from East heading S. S. E. made and later part the same so ends Lat 57.42 North

Thursday June 11th
Comes in with good weather and strong winds from E. S. E. saw whales and chert spoke Enterprise of Nantucket and ship Ben Tucker Veteran made and later part the same so ends Lat by 66 57.28 N Long 42.20 W

Friday June 12th 1857
Comes in with good weather and light winds from S. W. heading E. by N. saw one whale and chert ship made and later part the same saw whales and chert so ends Lat 57.45 N Long 41.40 W

Saturday June 13th
Comes in with good weather and light winds from N. E. heading E. S. E. saw whales and chert saw a number of ships made and later part good weather at 4 P. M. board for a whale struck him killed him and took him a long time and commenced cutting him in so ends No 66

Sunday June 14th
Comes in with good weather and light winds from E. S. E. heading North men employed in cutting a whale at 4 P. M. finished whale and later part rany at 5 P. M. commenced boiling so ends No 66

Monday June 15th
Comes in with rany weather and strong winds from E. S. E. heading North overboard short sail men employed in boiling made and later part the same so ends
Lat by 66 57.47 North

Tuesday June 16th
Drops with good weather and light winds from E. S. E. heading North men employed in boiling 3 ships in sight so ends
Lat by 66 58.04 N
