Wednesday June 17th 1857
Comes in with good weather and moderate winds from East heading S. S. E. men employed in logging at 10 P.M. finished logging, midle and later part the same so ends
Lat by Ob 57.47 North Long 143.43 West

Thursday June 18th
Comes in with good weather and light winds from S. S. E. heading East midle and later part the same at 6 A.M. commenced Steaming down 11000 of oil so ends No Ob

Friday June 19th
Comes in with good weather and calm men employed in Steaming down oil in the main jacket at 4 P.M. finished midle and later part the same so ends
Lat by Ob 57.27 North Long 140.40 W

Saturday June 20th
Comes in with good weather and light winds from South Steaming North saw whales and chart midle and later part thick weather so ends No Ob

Sunday June 21th
Comes in with thick weather and strong winds from South 3 Ships in sight midle and later part the same
Lat by Ob 57.52 N Long 142.25 W

Monday June 22th 1857
Comes in with good weather and light winds from East heading S. S. E. midle and later part the same so ends
Lat by Ob 57.40 N. Long 141.22 W

Tuesday June 23th
Comes in with good weather and light winds from East heading S. S. E. midle and later part the same so ends
Lat by Ob 57.49 N

Wednesday June 24th
Comes in with good weather and light winds from East heading S. S. E. midle and later part the same
Lat by Ob 57.46 North Long 140.10 W

Thursday June 25th
Comes in with good weather and fresh winds from East heading S. S. E. saw whale board and struck one and had tow cut from him on the A count of eight midle and later part the same so ends
Lat by Ob 57.45 North

Friday June 26th
Comes in with good weather and light winds from S. E. saw one whale board struck him and he took the line midle and later part the same so ends No Ob
