Wednesday April the 28  
Comes in with strong winds from South and thick weather clearing by the wind back and back ice in the middle part near moderate later part light winds and A plenty of ice so ends No Ob

Thursday Apr the 29  
Comes in with light winds from N.E.W. and thick weather ice slow the westward at 7 P.M. spoke ship Lissa Adams of New Bedford later part thick weather and strong winds from South so ends No Ob

Ice

Friday April the 30  
Comes in with thick weather and strong winds from South heading West at 7 P.M. raised the ice and wore ship head S.E. middle and later part near moderate and winds from S.W. 2 ships in sight so ends Lat by Ob 55.53 N Long 153.54 E

Ice

Saturday May the 1. 1858  
Comes in with good weather and strong winds from N.W. heading N.E. 2 ships in company and ice in sight to the westward middle and later part calm so ends No Ob

Sunday May the 2  
Comes in with good weather and light winds from South steering N.E.W. saw 4 ships middle and later part strong winds so ends No Ob

Monday May the 3 1858  
Comes in with strong gales from S.E.W. with snow squalls heading West under short sail later part near moderate so ends Lat 56.55 N

Tuesday May the 4  
Comes in with strong winds from N.E.W. heading S.W. under close reefed top sails 10 ships in sight one A boiling middle and later part strong gales so ends No Ob

Wednesday May the 5  
Comes in with strong gales from South heading S.E. later part good weather 15 ships in sight 2 A boiling so ends Lat 57.21 N Long 154.2 E

Thursday May the 6  
Comes in with good weather and light winds from N.E.W. ice in sight and 15 ships middle and later part the same Lat 57.21 N Long 154.10 East

Friday May the 7  
Comes in with good weather and light winds from S.W. ice and ships plenty middle and later part strong winds from East steering North and S.E.W. in company with 5 or 6 ships at 11 A.M. saw the land Cape Oliver bearing N.W. 45 miles dist so ends No Ob
