the same so ends
Lat by Ob. 23.09 N

Friday Novth 28
Strong trades from East S.E. Steaming
South middle part squally
later part strong winds from S.E.
Steaming S.W. so ends
Lat by Ob. 21.16 N, Long. 154.18 W

Saturday Novth 29
Strong winds from S.E. Steaming
S.W. by W at 5 P.M. rained the East
end of snows bearing S.W. dist
30 miles at 6. Hove the Reading
S. by W at 8 stand of N by E at
11 P.M. rained the land later part
light winds so ends

Sunday Novth 30
Comes in with light buffaloe
winds from S.E. at 5 P.M. came
top anchor ~~the~~ twice & Murree and
mole in 30 fath of water later
part light winds from S.W. took
the anchor at 12 in heard of Laina
in 14 fathams so ends

Monday Decth 1
Comes in with good weather
later part the same men
employed in bunkering coar

Tuesday Decth 2
all hands bunkering coar
at 4 P.M. put it on board ship
64 barrels in
good order took 6 casks of beer
out of storeroom from the shore
later part the same discharged
4 crew men and ship's mate
Mr. Jackson so ends

Wednesday Decth 3
papers with good weather at 5 P.M.
took the anchor and left for
Wakoo so ends

Thursday Decth 4
papers with good weather and
light winds from N.W. rained

Friday Decth 5
papers with light winds at 7
A.M. took a pilot and a steamer
tug and went in tow handella
harbor
