

Ship Cincinnati Williams

Sunday July 3rd / 1859

First part calm and thick fog with
Light Winds from E. N. E. and fine weather
for the rest. Winds the same and thick
11 A.M. got under weigh bound to that
Course North So ends these 24 hours

Monday July 4th / 59

Comes in with Moderate Breeze from
E. N. E. and thick Steering North North
The same Course S. W. Latter part Strong
Sails from East and thick Shortened Sail
Making 4 hour tacks Braced up

Tuesday July 5th / 1859

Comes in with Strong Winds from East
and thick, 2 A.M. Cleared up, kept on
Steering West 1 P.M. Come in thick
Shortened Sail and Left on the Wind
Making 4 hour tacks Spoke Ship Hobomock

Wednesday July 6th / 59

First part Strong Winds from N. E.
and thick, heading in to it on the line
under Short Sail 4 A.M. Cleared up
Made Sail Steering W. N. W. 5 A.M. Near
Land Mid the Same running down with
Shore in company with Hobomock 6 P.M.
Come in thick Cleared up and anchored in
20 fathoms Water So ends these 24 hours

Thursday July 7th / 1859

Comes in with Strong Sails from N. E.
and thick 4 A.M. got under weigh
bound up Towards S. W. Bay Mid fresh
bats and clear 1 P.M. Come to anchor
off Steep bluff 4 Ships to anchor here
about 11 A.M. The same So ends these 24 hours

Friday July 8th / 1859

Comes in with Thick Weather and calm
12 A.M. Cleared up got under weigh with
A Breeze from N. E. Saw good many
Whale boats down Chasing Latter part
fresh Breeze and thick So ends

Saturday July 9th / 59

Takes with Light Winds from East
and thick Boats down Whaling Street
and took him along side and cutting
him in Ship to anchor about half way
from the Rocks to N. Shore So ends

Sunday July 10th / 59

Comes in with calm and thick
Weather Mid fresh Breeze from N. E.
Ship keeps Boiling Boats off Chasing
Whales Latter part fresh breeze and thick
So ends these 24 hours

Monday July 11th / 59

First part calm and thick
Mid and latter part Light Breeze
from N. E. No employed boiling
out blubber 4 boats off Whaling Sound

Tuesday July 12th / 59

Comes in with thick Weather and calm
10 A.M. got through boiling boats off
Whaling 1 P.M. boats come a board got
under weigh and went up the bay further
North and latter part Light Winds from
N. E. So ends these 24 hours
