

Ship Cincinnati Williams

Wednesday July 13th / 1859
Comes in With calm weather and clear
Mid side Winds from S. E. latter
part calm Boats off Whaling but could
not strike Men employed Stowing down
Nothing else worth mention

Thursday July 14th / 59
Comes in With fresh breezes from South and
fine weather Mid calm latter part
Late Winds from N. E. got the Ship into
weigh and went over to South Shore
all 5 Boats off Chasing Whales
Plenty of Whales but very wild some

Friday July 15th / 59
First Part of these 24 hours calm
and fine weather Mid and latter
part fresh breezes from N. E. Boats
off Whaling Struck one and took him
along side and cut him in
So Ends these 24 hours

Saturday July 16th
Comes in With late Winds from
N. E. and fine weather Boats off
Whaling Struck one and took him
along side and cut him in at 11
fresh gales and thick bore up small
After and put down by one latter
part heavy gales from N. E. and thick
S. A. M. Dropped small anchor under
foot So ends these 24 hours

Master In S. W. Bay, Ocho

Sunday July 17th / 1859
Comes in With fresh gales and thick
weather S. A. M. began to moderate
South Head dis 3 miles to anchor in 5
fathoms water Mid moderate breezes
from N. E. Tying out our black latter
part moderate breezes and raining called down
So Ends these 24 hours

Monday July 18th / 1859
Comes in With late Winds from S. W.
and rainy 2 Boats off Whaling Struck
and took him along side and cut
him men employed Boiling so
So Ends these 24 hours

Tuesday July 19th
Comes in calm Mid and latter
part strong gales from S. E. With
rain got under weigh and went
off shore about 1 mile 3 Boats
off So Ends these 24 hours

Wednesday July 20th
First Part fresh gales from N. E.
and rainy Mid calm latter part
moderate breezes from S. E. and fine
weather Men employed Boiling So ends

Thursday July 21st
First Part calm and pleasant Mid
fresh breezes from S. W. With rain Boats
off Whaling men employed Boiling
latter part calm 9 P. M. got through
Boiling So ends these 24 hours
