Tuesday, March 20th 1860
Comes in with light winds
and Calms Wind West N.E. 11
all sail out standing in on the
wind better part strong gales
from S.W. and clear under
Boat 18 Tops and closed Boats
and fore sail Redding N.E. Lat
38-28 Long 72-20 S. Ends

Wednesday, March 21st
Comes in with fresh breeze from
S.W. and clear under 2 Boats
and fore sail Redding N.E. 10
Got Main sail and gill saw a storm
Ship's Spokes Clipped Ship's Mast
from New York Bound to Australia
4 P.M. very strong gales from S.W.
with snow squalls better part under
closed Boat Tops sail Redding
N.E. Lat 39-45 Long 70-09 W.
S. Ends there 24 hours

Thursday, March 22nd
Comes in with strong gales from S.W.
with snow squalls under closed Boat
Tops sail course parted Redding N.E.
O.S. N. New Ship and got fore sail and
sub Redding N.E. 11 Wind now moderate
got sub Boat Tops 2 P.M. New Ship
again in Redding in shore latter
part heavy squalls closed Boat
Tops and hand fore sail New Ship Redding N.E. 11
Lat 40-35 Long 70-46

Friday, March 23rd 1860
Comes in with fresh breeze from
S.W. and heavy snow squalls on
the wind standing off shore
at day later more moderate
New Ship Redding in on the wind
carrying sub Boat Tops sails
and course 3 P.M. Made bay
Head 5 P.M. took a Pilot's boat
part fore wind from S.W. all sail
out working to Windward bay Head
Sail Bearing N.E. S. Ends

Saturday, March 24th
Passes with fresh breeze from
West and clear working to
Windward at Sun down off Beach
Sail sub better part working to
Windward S. Ends there 24 hours

Sunday, March 25th
Passes with fresh breezes
from S.W. working up coast against
Beach 6 P.M. Come to Anchor
of the Reef Watch Hill S. Ends
