day at home. Sat. S. 40°.

Wednesday, Sept. 1st

Commenced with heavy squall with rain from S.W. at 10.00 hauled up E. sails. At 11 P.M. doubtless reefed topsail and hauled jib, squall continued heavy hauled fore and Mtr. top sails, and mainsail. Latter part moderate gradually milder till 10.00 single reefed topsail & Mtr. top & sail. No observation.
