Friday Apr. 13th 1855

First part light breeze from N. and rising middle calm, latter part fresh breeze from N. with a heavy swell. Saw a bark on opposite tack. Steering N. by the wind

Saturday Apr. 14th

First part fresh breeze from N. by E. and cloudy, latter part moderate breeze from N. by E. with clear weather. Saw 2 sails. By the wind go

Lat. 20. 43 N.
Lon. 151. 13 W.

Sunday Apr. 15th

First part fine breeze from N. by E. and calm, latter part light air and calm. Saw a schooner bound to S. Course N. by E. N. E.

Lat. 20. 50 N.
Lon. 151. 10 W.

Monday Apr. 16th

First and middle parts calm, latter part light air from N. by E. Saw a bark steering N. and the course N. by E.

Lat. 20. 15 N.
Lon. 151. 55 W.

Tuesday Apr. 17th

First part light air from N. by E. at 12 M. took a breeze from N. by E. latter part hauled to N. by E. at 5 P. M. took a breeze to N. by E. Saw a brig steering to S. by E.

Lon. 151. 26 W.

Wednesday Apr. 18th

Fine breeze from N. by E. and pleasant weather. Steering by the wind N. by E.

Lon. 151. 59 W.

Thursday Apr. 19th

First part calm, latter part fresh breeze from N. by E. Course N. by E.

Lat. 33. 30 N.
Lon. 151. 40 W.

New Bedford on board bark Sarah Thea

Friday Apr. 20th

Fresh breeze from N. and N. by E. with cloudy weather. Course N. by E. Then at 7 A. M. 65° at 12 M. 66° at 3 P. M. 70° at 4, 72°. Air from 86° to 72° Southern edge of the Gulf Stream

Lat. 36. 09 N.
Lon. 68. 47 W.

Saturday Apr. 21st

Commenced with strong breeze from N. by E. and fine cloudy, at sunset doubled reefed topsails at 11 P. M. wind hauled to N. by E. at 3 A. M. wore ship to N. by E. and hauled fore topsail, fore sail, jib & main sail. Saw a bark & brig. Wind moderate but very rough, course N. by E.

Lat. 37. 25 N.
Lon. 69. 23 W.

Sunday Apr. 22nd

First part light baffling air, latter part fine breeze from S. and fair weather. Saw several sails, course N. by E.

Lat. 38. 05 N.
Lon. 70. 25 W.

Monday Apr. 23rd

Commenced with fine breeze from S. and fine weather. Middle part hauled to N. by E. at 3 P. M. made Black Island bearing N. distance 26 miles, at 4 1/2 took a pilot. Bent chains and got anchor of bows.

Lat. 40. 34 N.

Tuesday Apr. 24th

Fine breeze through the night and clear weather. Steering up the bay, at 5 P. M. anchored at Clark's point light, furled sails and went ashore, 132 days from Honolulu to
