Commenced with light and fresh SE
Bar N heading to South & East saw many hump-
back no whales Made & Vatter part weather fine
Piss & Squal in sight

Monday 23rd

Commenced with moderate breeze from
Eastward Bar N and the Northern tack
nothing in sight that looks like whales
Made part off Squal Vatter part at 10 AM
Boat went on shore

Tuesday 24th
Vying off and on

Commenced with fine weather Bar N
lying off and on Made & Vatter part the
same

Wednesday 25th

Commenced with pleasant weather Made
& Vatter part weather the same up & on

Thursday 26th

Commenced with moderate breezes
Bar N heading South Made part heard ship
by up NE wind short sail Vatter part
headed to SE wind NE

Friday 27th

Commenced with strong breezes and gale
Bar N under short sail Made & Vatter part the
nothing in sight

Saturday Aug 28th 1858

Commenced with strong breezes from SE
Bar N by the wind by up SE & under easy sail
nothing in sight at sunset fired the main sail
Made part equally Vatter part heard ship &
Northward

Sunday 29th

Commenced with moderate breezes from
SE & Bar N heading to the Northward nothing
in sight but we still hope that the Olive
Rock of all things will guide and direct
us and at last return us with a breeze
Made part Bar N heading SE under short sail
Vatter part at daylight made all sail at 11 AM
Saw New heading NE &

Monday 30th

Commenced with moderate breezes and
pleasant wind SE Bar N heading N to NE
with all sail set saw the Island of
St. Miguel at sunset shortened sail
Bar N heading NE & Made part calm Vatter part
Saw New to Eastward St. Miguel in sight

Long 126.13 W

Tuesday 31st

Commenced with moderate breezes from NE
Bar N and the Port tack by up E to SE at sunset
shortened sail saw fountains Made & Vatter
part off St. Miguel standing off and on many
fish Boats but no whales
