

Saturday Oct 8th 1860.

Commenced with light Trades and Cloudy
Bark on the Eastern Tack. S. up E. & E. Midair put
the same Vatter part at 2.4 M. Head Ship S. up N. W.

Sunday 9th Vatter Oct 8th 1860 6.45 W.

Commenced with strong Trades and Cloudy
at 1 P.M. Tack S. up E. & E. I saw Comfish
and shotted sail at sunset. Midair part with
squally Vatter part made sail saw ten back Porpoise
and Comfish and we hope soon to see Spun Whales

Monday 10th Vatter Oct 9th 1860 6.45 W.

Commenced with strong Trades and Cloudy
Bark on the Eastern Tack. S. up from E. to E. & E.
sailing in want of air not much. we went
out blowing day in and day out

Tuesday 11th Vatter Oct 10th 1860 4.00

Nothing in sight but I presume it is
all for the best employed making shoes
Midair part weather cloudy Vatter part weather
more Pleasant

Wednesday 12th Vatter Oct 11th 1860 3.25

Weather moderate made an sail saw Comfish
and hope soon to see whales Midair part
and I may say the Vatter the same

Thursday 13th Vatter Oct 12th 1860 3.10

Weather Pleasant but nothing in sight
but one Schooner and one Black fish
could not see any of them
Midair part heading to the N. W. Vatter part to the
Eastward nothing in sight

Saturday Oct 12th 1860 2.45 W.

Friday Oct 12th 1860

Commenced with moderate Trades and
Cloudy saw a Schooner and we hope
and pray we may see Whales soon for I am
feeling rather miserable and I think a little
whale oil would do me good

at sunset Tack S. to the N. W. and S. up N. W.
Vatter part saw Black fish but got none. Bark
on the Eastern Tack S. up E. & E. saw two Barks

Saturday 13th Vatter Oct 12th 1860 1.50

Commenced with moderate Trades saw
and got one Black fish and hope next to get
a Spun Whale Midair Vatter part weather cloudy
nothing in sight

Sunday 14th Vatter Oct 13th 1860 2.25

Bark heading to Eastward

Monday 15th

Saw and examined with Bark Calender
stopped in Breeze at night

Tuesday 16th

Bark heading to Eastward saw Black fish
got one

Wednesday 17th

Staying in port for some time from Westward

Thursday 18th

Came at anchor at 4 P.M. Bark Bryanna
Schooner lying here anchored in the harbor
with 30 fathoms of chain
