

Sund. July 15th 1860
Circumnavigated with Squally Trade Ship and Barge
in sight but no Whales and I will try next morn.
but it seems hard for we are sadly in want of Oil
Midall part the same Valler part saw Blackb's
Boat and Ship South Head hardly
Mond. 16th

Boat and Ship. South Head Landy
Monday 16th
Commenced with moderate breeze and clear
Breeze freshening off shore middle & water part
beating in shore 4

Commenced with Pleasant seas cruising
and no Whales but Plenty of Ships mostly of Water
with the same Plenty of Ships but no Whales

Wednesday 18th
Commenced with Pleasant Trade
at 4 PM Hauled with Bar. R. Ohio Bros. Bldgs.
Baked mackerel 22 M⁴ but too cold all but
mackerel & Vallen part Cruising

Thursday 17th
Commenced with light trade
cruising saw Blackfish and three Bonitos
and all part calm latter part wind light.

Friday 20th
 Commenced with Mary, made Jack in the
 saw-Imbucke Micae part Lammed with the 18th of
 New Bedford Paper Machine & 10th out 200 Rills

Saturday 21st
Commences with a fine day and
clear sky nothing in sight but land and B. K.

Sunday July 22nd 1860.
Commenced with moderate breeze at 4. PM
Tacked of Hove and shall by further West
the tiny bright vessels in sight. Minors all past heady
N. M. Vatten past the same saw many Linbacks and
black fish at midian though we see sperm whale
but was disappointed. Tally Oct 4 miles Hong Kong

Commenced with moderate trades Stead N. W. until sunset then luffed to the wind to S. W. took in the light sails and we all hope to see some whales then being no ships made & full pack started 11 AM then saw ship and started E. N.

Tuesday 24th
 Commenced with strong trade breeze
 nothing in sight and we are sadly in want
 of fire food we are feeling poor small & disagreeable
 weather fine but nothing to do not being able to
 see Whales but good news Best

Val 2nd & 3rd of Oct
Wednesday 25th
Commences with moderate winds
and Pleasant but nothing of what I saw
it is now nearly six months since we have
any moderate & warm past weather - fine but
nothing but the sand in sight

Thursday 21th
Commenced with Hopes and Prayers
that we may get a whale tomorrow
I will put another fine Vanner past the
Two Barks and a Ship
