

Wednesday June 26th 1861
Commenced with strong Trades Sailed for St. John's
Same part Sailed of for Charles Island

Thursday 27th
Anchored at Charles Island. Obtained Wood and fine
very good breeding

Friday 28th
Finished working with a Boat after oranges and another fishy
for Mrs. Russell and plenty of fish

Saturday 29th
Left under high and fresh breeze weather fine middle part
Calm latter part Sailed to the Eastward weather squally
Lat. 46° 13' N Long. 90° 30' W

Sunday July 1st
Commenced with moderate Trades and
Pleasant saw Sulphur Bottoms and hope
and pray we may see sperm Whales soon
middle of latter part squally and nothing in sight
but I sincerely hope we shall get some Whales soon
Lat. 46° 20' N Long. 90° 30' W

Monday 2nd
Commenced with moderate Trades Bark heading
the Eastward and sail in sight. Plenty of Sails
& Ships but no Whales however not hope for the
Best

Tuesday 3rd
Plenty of Ships Barks and Sails in sight
but nothing more

Wednesday 4th
Have only seen one Ship so we have had
to spend the day without company

Thursday 5th
Weather squally and no Whales

Friday 6th
Weather squally saw several Barks but no Whales

Saturday July 7th 1861
Commenced with Pleasant Trades
Bark on the Southern Tack by up S.W. at 9 P.M.
hauled with B.R. Martin Doble's Mast 13 ft
out for Spinn at 6 P.M. hauled with Ben Scott
Made part heading to the Eastward latter part
stayed off N.W. saw Blackfish

Sunday 8th
Commenced with moderate Trades Charles Island
in sight B.R. N. middle part heading to the light
under short sail latter part. Towed off N.E.

Monday 9th
Saw Bristol Island and I am sure I saw
although we may see Whales in the morning
no Whales and no signs of any

Tuesday 10th
Commenced with Bark Martin Doble's Mast
Doble's Mast in the Vulture Man in the Pacific
Bark. D. dead what have I done that we are
so unfortunate God only knows

Wednesday 11th
Commenced with Pleasant Trades South
Head of Albermarle in sight at sunset
spoke Bark Stella New Bedford Hussey Master
14 M.T. out 170 Bbls Sperm Oil

Thursday 12th
Boreas Bark Bales 3rd New Bedford Hussey
Master 35 Bbls since leaving Salsmann
Plenty of Ships but no Whales but I hope for the
Best and all I can say is God grant we may
get some Oil soon

Friday 13th
Commenced with moderate Trades Bark
cruising off the Bay and nothing in sight
but Blackfish and Barks
