Once the the same Breeze to the Southward then by up to 1/2
 and I think I shall let her go all night made past
 the same Vatter part at daylight the Breeze by up to 1/2

 times the three times got two made Vatter part then

Wednesday 18th

Commenced with moderate Trades heard ship

 then I think it is all for the best we have seen
 Sulphur bottoms and Puffins and also saw two that
 we should see sperm whales on the morning and got
 a good cut of oil made Vatter part made the
 same saw a Breeze to the South the distance about
 4 leagues but it proved to be a sulphur bottom

Commenced with strong Trades Breeze on the Southward
 Jack by up to 1/2 by 1/2 at sunset shortened sail Vatter part
 Vatter part weather squally Jack to the E. S. E.

Commenced with strong Trades Breeze on the Eastward Jack
 by up to 1/2. E. S. E. saw a Breeze made sail thinking
 she saw whales and to it proved we got along in the
 1/2 mile and got a large whale made past took the whale
 alongside of the Henry Tabor Vatter part went on board
 and helped cut the whale Lat 42° 10' N Long 121° 10' W

Saturday 21st

Commenced with strong Trades Breeze on the Eastward Jack
 helping cut the whale Lat 42° 10' N Long 121° 10' W

Sunday 22nd

Commenced with strong Trades Breeze on the Eastward Jack
 Southward made past the same Vatter part then
 ship to the Eastward Lat 42° 10' N Long 121° 10' W

Commenced with strong Trades Breeze on the Eastward Jack
 at 3 1/2 P.M. saw Breeze to the Eastward made sail
 at 4 1/2 P.M. saw the Breeze struck and got down
 and two Breeze then it made past took the whale
 alongside Vatter part at 5 1/2 Commenced cutting at
 10 finished Lat 42° 10' N Long 121° 10' W

Tuesday 24th

Commenced with strong Trades Breeze on the Eastward Jack
 heard a ship to the N. E. Vatter part Breeze ship
 Southward. Employed Breeze Lat 42° 10' N Long 121° 10' W

Wednesday 25th

Commenced with strong Trades Breeze on the Eastward Jack
 Jack on fire a Breeze made Vatter part the same
 finished Breeze the whale has turned up 4 1/2 Breeze to
 3 Breeze of Breeze Lat 42° 10' N Long 121° 10' W

Thursday 26th

Commenced with moderate Trades Breeze on the Eastward Jack
 Eastward Jack at noon or an hour off thinking to come
 with the N. E. Breeze but proved to be a ship Breeze to
 1/2 at sunset up to 1/2 by 1/2 at sunset shortened sail Vatter part
 made Vatter part weather squally Jack to the Eastward
 Lat 42° 10' N Long 121° 10' W
