

Remarks on board Scho Clara L. Sparks

Thursday June 1

This day begins with fresh breeze from the S with a heavy swell heaving from the N running to the SNE
Lat 32.04 Lon 70.41

Friday June 2

This day commences with fresh breeze from the westward running to the SNE at about 6 AM raised a vessel to the surface and down to her end found her bottom with a metal nearly new painted white apparently but a short time in that condition probably a further bound out, latter part more moderate fresh over and smooth east
Lat 32.58 Lon 68.42

Saturday June 3

This day commences with light winds from the westward and fine weather running to the eastward at 3 PM saw a school of Blackfish barrels and struck one but she soon escaped

Sunday June 4

This day begins with light winds from the Southward at ten thirty 10.30 raised a school of sperm whales from the decks lowered and took one to the Larboard Boat took him along side and cut him in finished cutting at 1 PM Lat 33.18 Lon 66.50

This day begins with light winds from the Southward all hands to work boiling out the head Lat 33.23 Lon =

This day begins with fresh breeze from the South finished boiling at 4 AM and commenced stowing down finished stowing down at 5 PM stowed down 25 Barrels

This day commences with fresh breeze from the South running to the eastward latter part wind to the NW struck the lee and cleared up no observation to day

Thursday June 8

This day begins with light wind and good weather from the SNE steering E at 1 PM hoisted the mainsail and soft topsail latter part steering SSE with fine weather

This day begins with light winds from the SNE with moderate course SSE latter part more breeze from the same quarter
Lat 33.00 Lon 60.52

Saturday June 10

This day commences with fresh breeze from the SNE latter part more moderate now to the eastward
Lat 32.38 Lon 58.50

Sunday June 11

This day begins with light winds from the SNE and pleasant weather steering to the eastward latter part wind started more to the eastward
Lat 32.18 Lon 58.16

Monday June 12

This day begins with light winds from the SNE standing to the eastward hoisted the mainsail at 6 AM latter part calm saw a school of Porpoises and a sail in sight bound to the Southward
