Monday July 10

Whale

This day begins with fresh breezes from the SW with
equally weather running to the North at 130 P.M. and ship
and row to the entrance at 2 P.M. raised a sperm whale
close to the vessel going to the windward gives and said
after her at 4.15 - lowered but never saw her afterwards
come on board at sunset Lat 31.56 Long 46.18

Tuesday July 11

This day begins with fresh breezes from the SW with ship
at sunrise and stood to the North at 6 P.M. ran her off
to the entrance Lat 32.43 Long 46.34

Wednesday July 12

This day begins with fresh breezes from the SW with rain
running N by E at 1 P.M. and ship and row to the SW
batter part more moderate Lat 33.05 Long 46.04

Thursday July 13

This day begins with light winds from the westward running
to the SW at 1 P.M. backed and stood to the SW
Lat 32.12 Long 46.08

Friday July 14

This day begins with light winds from the westward
with pleasant weather steering N by E - batter part
more moderate Lat 33.20 Long 46.08

Saturday July 15

This day begins with light winds from the SW with
pleasant weather running to the SW
Lat 33.38 Long 46.29

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Sunday July 16

This day begins with light winds from the SW with
pleasant weather running to the SW with a school of
brown porpoise in sight Lat 34.15 Long 46.24

Monday July 17

This day commences with light winds from the
westward steering to the eastward at 9 P.M. raised a
whaling Scho. which proved to be the Helen Simmons
3 months out with 110 Barrels of Sperm Spermaceae and 100
said a Bark vessel from St. Peter's Bay to Washington
Lat 34.18 Long 46.50

Tuesday July 18

This day begins with light winds from the
westward running to the eastward the other Scho. in sight
batter part moderate Lat 33.48 Long 46.34

Wednesday July 19

This day begins with light winds from the southward
running off the eastward saw a school of humpback
Scho. No Simmons in sight to the SW
Lat 33.34 Long 46.44

Thursday July 20

This day begins with light winds from the eastward
batter part calms two sails in sight Lat 33.21 Long 46.06

Friday July 21

This day begins with light winds from the eastward
a ship and one brig in sight - batter part calms
Lat 33.00 Long 46.27
