Tuesday April 3

Begins with light winds running N.W. by W. now two sails in sight bound to the Kailash Lat 13.45 Long 35.15

Wednesday April 4

Continues with light winds from the N.W. see one thermometer. Begs bound to the Kailash took in sail at sunset and hour to Lat 14.00 Long 37.31

Thursday 5

Begins with light trade winds see one sail bound Kailash steering S.W. by W. Lat 13.35 Long 38.37

Friday April 6

Whales

Begins with light winds at 7.30 saw several whales off our lee beam saw four others turning out to be sperm whales. lowered for them but they being startled did not get on our bow and took the boat up. lowered again in the afternoon wait for a mention and struck took out about forty fathoms line and the men came out so was this day Lat 13.41 Long 39.45

Saturday April 7

Begins with fresh trade winds on whaling Lat 13.45 Long 39.34 Barks in sight to the westward more ships on a star to the east the day

Sunday April 8

Begins with fresh trade winds bound to the Kailash the Bark Perseus latter half more moderate Lat 13.40 Long 39.50

Monday April 9

Begins with fresh winds see the Bark Perseus in sight Lat 13.40 Long 39.52

Tuesday April 10

Begins with light moderate winds latter half more breeze see a Bark in sight to the leeward had no observation Lat 14.15 Long =

Wednesday April 11

This day begins with light winds from the N.W. moderate fresh more moderate running to the N.W. by W. and N.W. Lat 13.45 Long 40.36

Thursday April 12

This day begins with fresh trade winds running to the N.W. we sail in sight bound to the Kailash Lat 13.43 Long 41.29

Friday April 13

Begins with fresh trade winds left the off on a star to the N.W. under moon then more ship on a star to the N.W. at 4 P.M. saw three whaling vessels in sight to the leeward Lat 13.45 Long 42.34
