Monday July 23

cutting fine tows and now and then the blubber and dipper
in canes Lat 31.30 Long 49.34

Tuesday July 24

Begins with light steady winds commencing blowing
at 3 AM at sunrise a large Spout whale
close to the vessel lowered for him but he was 9 or
10 miles off the vessel and started off gave chase but
was not successful in striking came on board at 1 PM
finished blowing at 5.00. Lat 31.52 Long 49.03

Wednesday July 25

This day begins with light winds from the
S.W. but sail in sight lower to the S.E.
better part more moderate Lat 32.03 Long 49.03

Thursday July 26

Begins with light winds from the S.W.
blowing to the S.E. one sail in sight
lower to the S.W. Lat 32.00 Long 49.49

Friday July 27

Begins with light winds from the S.W. with
varying weather nothing in sight. Lat 32.13 Long 49.30

Saturday July 28

Begins with light winds from the S.W.
with plenty of rain blowing to the W.N.W.
had no observation

Sunday July 29

Begins with light winds from the S.W.
blowing to the W.N.W. nothing in sight
Lat 32.40 Long 49.00

Monday July 30

Begins with light winds from the S.W.
blowing to the W.N.W. took in the
Monsoon on account of a squall one
sail in sight. observation to the S.E.
had no observation to day
