

Remarks on Board wh. Clara L. Sparks

Sunday Aug 25 1878

came in with a fresh breeze from the SW
middle and latter part wind and weather
the same so ends this day

Lat 35.20 N Lon 36.00 W

Monday Aug 26 1878

came in with a fresh breeze from the
SW middle part the same picked up
a barrel of Rosemary oil at 5 P.M. had
a heavy squall wind shifted to the
SE and weather more moderate with
rain so ends. We picked up barrel Rosemary

Lat 36.33 N Lon 36.25 W

Tuesday Aug 27 1878

came in with a strong breeze from the
eastward two whaling barges in sight
middle and latter part strong breezes
so ends

Lat 35.45 N Lon 35.40 W

Wednesday Aug 28

came in with fresh breeze from the E
two whaling Barges in sight middle and
latter part more moderate so ends

Lat 35.23 N Lon 35.00 W

Thursday Aug 29 1878

came in with a moderate breeze from
the SE and fine weather middle and
latter part the same so ends

Lat 35.00 N Lon 35.12 W

Friday Aug 30 1878

came in with a fresh breeze from the
SE and fine weather middle and
latter part the same so ends

Lat 36.34 N Lon 33.20 W

Saturday Aug 31 1878

came in with a strong breeze from the
SW steering to the eastward middle part
strong breeze and rough sea at 10 P.M. saw
sperm whales lowered two Boats but did
not strike. heavy sea running carried away
the stem Bolt to the fore stay put two
tables on and kept her off for Fayal
distant about 120 miles, soon steering East
latter part strong breeze so ends

Lat 37.21 N Lon 31.00 W

Sunday Aug Sept 1st 1878

came in with a strong breeze from the SW
at 6 P.M. saw Fayal bearing E by E distant
about 40 miles middle part strong breezes
at noon the Capt went ashore at Fayal
at 3 P.M. sent the Boat off the Barge
Lauria of New Bedford laying off and on
latter part the same laying off and on so ends
