Thursday Dec 17 1845

came in with a light breeze from the N.E.
and fine weather middle part the same
spoke up. Sailing Boats had taken 25
barrel this season 35 from all told
so on latter part fine

Lat 26.00 S Lon 35.19 W

Wednesday Dec 18 1845

came in with a moderate breeze from the N.E.
and cloudy middle part the same latter part
rainy so ends this day

Lat 26.03 S Lon

Thursday Dec 19 1845

came in with a light air from the N.E.
and rain middle part moderate breeze
from the N.E. and cloudy latter part
the same so ends

Friday Dec 20 1845

came in with light air and calm
middle part light breeze from the N.E.
spoke the Bark Perry had taken 20
barrel from since leaving St. Michael
latter part the same so ends

Lat 25.41 S Lon 35.23 W

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Saturday Dec 21 1845

came in with a moderate breeze from
the N.E. and fine weather middle part
the same the Bark Perry in sight latter
part moderate so ends this day

Lat 25.33 S Lon 35.59 W

Sunday Dec 22 1845

came in with a strong breeze from the
N.E. at sunrise saw the Bark in the lee
quarter running off shortly after set her
sails for whaler. Kept off and ran down to her
found she had got her small whale so on
allible and latter part strong breeze
doubtless the Perry and took the
Barnet out the file so ends

Lat 26.00 S Lon 36.24 W

Monday Dec 23 1845

came in with strong breeze from the N.E.
at daylight blowing a gale here too under
the Bark Perry and Barnet out the Perry
middle part the same covered away the
port rope of the Perry and covered it down
and expended it at 5 P.M. very high heading
to the Eastward latter part more moderate
with rain Barometer down to 29 and 3 tenths
so ends
