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Wednesday May 4th Lying at Deming all hands
employed with water get 100 barrels left &
there, not very well

Wednesday May 5th Lying at Deming & employed
part of the week. Met & visited with
Capt. Walter Perry - 1847

Thursday May 6th lying at Lemnizie all
day. Am going getting water & wood and
ballast. finished with 230 Dr. L.

Friday May 7th lying at Lemmon getting
up at 6 AM & took in brief shoot of
Turkey Vulture sp P.M. Bird I.H. Smith. etc.
Schr M & Gimmens sailed at 6 P.M.

Saturday May 8th Lying at Des Moines raining all day. I did some packing at 5 P.M. got under way on an Ea with the Ark. Matthesen. The Ark men come in to see the day after Nov.

Sunday May 9 all this day fresh trucks.
 Jan 3 sails at 5 P.M. come the anchor at St. Eustace.
 John J. N. Phillips M. E. Gummus Ellen Rodman &
 Benj. D. N. Small in fact so ends this day

Monday May 10th Lying at St. Eustatia in
the V.M. put on some new breeches & fireproofing
& let it up referred for at 2nd P.M. Sir M. M. M. M.
came in. & at early this day with great success

Tuesday May 11th lying at Cautato. Squally
with heavy swell on. no painting

Wednesday May 12th Lymij at St. Eustatius
got potatoes and Yams on board Counselman
on board put 6 Men on the boats
No arrivals in day yesterday

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Thursday Nov 13th Lying at Kauratua 19 mi S of
all day waiting for mail the Simmons and Brig Tabled

Stridley May 14 # lying at anchor in morning
overhauled Menzies' wheel at 3 P.M. Feb. 1904.
came too lying off 400 n. with 254 whale

Saturday 15th lying at anchor at 6 P.M. got underway and sailed off Gen. at midnight - took some of with 3 men left off and run N N W 1/2 N.

Sunday 16th All this day light. Reached Steyer
N.Y. at 8 P.M. Took ship for Somboro in the
S.C. at 9. Arrived Steyer at 11. N. nearly 88° W.

Wednesday 17 May. first part of this day fine
weather. Light sailing. wind without changes and
strove towards the port. Specially saw one sail

Tuesday May 18th. All this day bent tracks
steering W of N. Saw one sail steering N N W

Wednesday May 19th 1844 This day fresh trades
and squally. Saw one sail. Set ends this day
during N by W under 4 lower sails.

Thursday May 20th All this day fresh trades
heading N by E. nothing in sight.

Friday May 21st First part of this day
went to Bryers Run - C. & E. Low & Gail, with
first fresh look in Wapail & Wapail at 7 PM. First
S. Minisail & Wapail jet set up at 8 PM. Sick

Saturday May 22nd all this day gentle breeze
from E.N.E. Had 4 sails. one masted war. so chd
this day heading N. with 4 mastsails
Capt no better
