

1875 Remarks on board Bark Clarice
Nov 30th Begins with fine breezes and squally
weather Wind N. Westerly Bk steering
S. E. by E. employed about ship duties
the Onan Tribel getting obstinent did
not like to obey orders sent him to
masthead Middle and latter part
Light winds and Calm
Lat 24.04 Long 18.13
Wednesday Dec 1st

Begins with light winds and
Calm Bk working to the Eastward
Watch employed with ship duty
Middle part light winds North Easterly
Bk steering E. S. E. and E. by South
Latter part sighted the Canary Isles
Lat 25.36 Long 18.36
Saw several Sail Watch employed with
Ship duty

Thursday Dec 2nd
Begins with light breezes from
the North steering to the Southward
the Island of Palma to the right and Left &
Gomera to the right At sundown Shorten-
ed sail and brought the ship to the wind
on Starboard tack Mandyard aback
Island of Palma bearing East distant
about 8 miles Middle part about same
latter part Variable winds Bk working to
the South East saw the Isle of Teneriff
Watch employed with ship duty

Friday 3rd
Begins with variable winds Bk ste-
ering by the wind on Port tack the Isle of
Gomera off Starboard beam, Palma on
Port Quarter and Teneriff on Port Bow
Sunset light winds and Calm
Middle part Bk heading to the South
under easy sail
Latter part fine breezes Bk heading
to the N. West by the wind lost
sight of the Isles
Watch employed with ship duty

on A Whaling Voyage Merchant Master
Saturday Dec 4th

Comes in with fine breezes from
S. E. Bk steering by the wind on Port tack
nothing in sight Watch employed as
usual Middle part Bk standing by the
wind under all sail
Lat 24.04 Long 18.44
Latter part very much the same employed
Breaking out clouds Port & E

Sunday Dec 5th 1875 Begins with fine breezes from the Eastward
Bk. Rty. by the wind to the Southward saw Finbacks
Porpoises and birds Watch employed about ship
duties Middle part squally with lightning thunder
and rain wind westerly
Lat 23.38 Long 18.57
Latter part strong breezes from the westward
Bark steering by the wind on Starboard tack

Monday Dec 6th
All these 24 hours light winds and calms
Bk working to the westward saw Finbacks, humpers,
Lat 22.48 Long 18.57
Porpoises, fish &c. Watch employed with ship
duties Blasted Water
Tuesday Dec 7th

All these 24 comes in with light breezes
from the westward Bk by the wind on Port tack
Middle part about same latter part fine breezes
from Westward Bk on Starboard tack
Lat 23.42 Long 19.46
Employed as usual
Wednesday 8th

All these 24 hours fine breezes from
the Westward Bark steering by the wind on Port
and Starboard tacks watch employed with ship
duties Saw a number of sail (Merchantmen)
Lat 22.44 Long 21.14

Thursday Dec 9th
Begins with fine breezes from the
Westward Bark by the wind on Port tack at 1 hour P.M.
tacked Ship and about to the Southward
saw a number of sail and several Finbacks
watch employed about ship duties Broke out
Sugar Middle part light breezes Bk heading to the
Southward latter part fine breezes which proved to
be finbacks saw several sail employed as usual
Lat 22.35
