Wednesday 29th

Begins with fine and pleasant
weather Bark under all sail working
to the Westward saw several sail also
Porpoises & small fish employed
Coopering out ~~the~~ Middle part Bark
on port tack under easy sail
scatter part fine breezes from N.E.
saw Whaling boats of D. Small about 1 year
out with about 390 bbls sperm oil all told

Thursday 30th

Begins with fine breezes from N.E.
Bark on opposite tacks under all sail
in company with A.D. Small at sundown
took in light sails Bark on Starboard
tack at 9 P.M. wore ship and stood
by the wind to the Eastward Middle part
same scatter part strong breezes from
N.E. at daylight raised ~~up~~ ^{up} ~~the~~ ^{the} ~~whales~~
along side to leeward called all hands
and cleared away ~~the~~ ^{the} ~~whales~~
stepped off to leeward having ~~been~~ ^{been} ~~galled~~
by the ship and the boats after they
chased a short time when the whales
started off to windward lowered away
S. Boat in hopes of cutting them off by

the top sails & furled Mainsail, Gibb & Spanker
nothing in sight Middle Bark on Port tack
strong breezes with some rain
at Daylight saw Brig D. Small to leeward
wore ship and stood by the wind to the southward
Watch employed Breaking out provisions

Apr
Saturday April 1st

Begins with strong trades and
pleasant weather Bark on Starboard
tack by the wind wearing flying Gibb &
Mainsail & gallant sail D. Small to leeward
at sundown shortened sail Middle part
Bark on Port tack scatter part strong trades
Bark under Double reef Top sails & Courses
on Starboard tack Watch employed about
ship duty

Sunday 2nd

Begins with strong trades Bark on
Starboard tack at 2.30 P.M. wore ship and
stood to the Eastward by the wind at
sundown furled the Mainsail Middle part
same latter part strong trades Bark on
Port tack by the wind under double reefs
Courses, Gibb & Spanker saw Brig D. Small
to windward

Monday 3rd

Begins with fine weather and moderate breeze
at 30 P.M. saw a sail a sail which proved to be
Bark Sarah B. Hale Capt. Slocum 1 year out
with 175 bbls all told Middle part Bark on port
tack under Double reef top sails Courses, Gibb & Spanker
latter part fine breezes Bark on Starboard
tack under all sail Watch employed
about ship duty saw 2 sail
